To the Johnson County 4-H Community,

Many think of November and December as months for 4-H to slow down with several community clubs delaying meetings and officer elections until after the start of the new calendar year. This slowdown may be true for meetings or activities but it should not be the case for planning. Now is a busy time for planning and it is important to plan early winter organizational meetings, officer trainings, and determine leader trainings/certifications to ensure 2018 is a positive youth development experience for our members.

At the start of the 2017-2018 4-H year, JC had 11 of the 12 community clubs undergoing the UWE chartering/renewal process with new leadership in one club and another club searching for an adult leader. In the WY 4-H Program, a club is defined as having at least 5 youth enrolled from separate families with a certified adult volunteer guiding the club. During the recent club chartering and renewal process, club leaders were given the new template for club by-laws and were asked about enrollment of new members. Several clubs (as delineated in their bylaws) are full and the potential of reducing a club (Blue Ribbon 4-H Club) would restrict options for potential members and is of great concern.

Leader feedback during chartering meetings included requests for more trainings, whether for adults or youth taking on elected offices to better understand their duties. Research shows highly effective 4-H clubs take time for training and set aside time to train youth for the roles they will assume. Well-functioning clubs do not just happen but result from consistent efforts to create, maintain, and (occasionally) restore traditions.

Now with winter upon us, please let us know what is needed to help ensure the best possible new 4-H year. The most important factor for the overall quality of the Johnson County 4-H program is dedicated, caring and certified adult volunteers. Leader training in 2016 - 2017 included: Effective Club Meetings/ Board training by UWE /CDE Michelle Pierce, 4-H new Leader orientation, new 4-H member orientation, State 4-H office established a new online leader trainings, and a regional Shooting Sports Certification was held in Buffalo. Let us know how we might continue to grow the Johnson County 4-H Program together.

The Treasurer's Report provided (see attached sheet) included expenses totaling \$9,818.14 and income totaling \$4090.00, and included current balances for Other Accounts: Livestock Judging - \$3,219.59; Shooting Sports - \$2,673.00; and 4-H @ Work - \$2,469.25. Elizabeth Downare amended the current balance of the Washington Focus account, as money reimbursed for national trips is now taken from the Sponsorships account. Teresa Bessler made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report as amended, Kami Kennedy seconded, motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Jim Dawson provided copies of the new '2017-2018 Johnson County 4-H Council Committees,' requesting that members from each 4-H community club serve on a committee. Please share this at your club meetings.

Programs: Jim discussed the need to recruit new 4-H leaders for clubs and project areas. As far as workshops for projects, it was suggested that some clinics be scheduled in January so that kids have more time during the 4-H year to prepare for county fair.

Publicity: The Buffalo Bulletin is waiting on State Fair results to publish. Casey Rodriguez suggested that the 4-H Council consider an E-blast via the Chamber website. As Chamber members, the 4-H Council can share information with Jennifer at the Chamber which will go out to other Chamber members about 4-H events, results, club information, fair, etc. Jim Dawson will pursue with Jennifer.

Fundraisers: Bomber Mountain Civic Center has been reserved for March 23rd for the 2018 4-H Carnival. Looking for a new committee head for the 4-H Carnival Committee. Kristen Hepp has an organized, typed timeline and information to pass on to the new committee head.

Awards and Recognition: Achievement Night, October 21, 2017 at the Community Building was well attended. The junior leaders came up with a fun game for the kids. Amanda and Gio Monterastelli baked and decorated the cakes for the event.

Livestock Committee: On November 7, 2017, the Livestock Committee selected new executive board members: Blane Ruby, President; Matt Rabel, Vice President; Jackie Benton, Secretary; and Amanda Kaufmann, Treasurer. Beef tagging date set for January 21, 2018. The main discussion at the meeting was biosecurity of animals, and having vet checks of all animals before being brought into the Johnson County Fairgrounds. 4-H @ Work

Internal Audit Committee - This is a new requirement under the new WY 4-H policies. Community clubs are required to turn in a complete, up-to-date treasurer's book at the end of the 4-H year. 4 clubs/year will be audited. **OLD BUSINESS**

-Club Chartering and Renewal. All clubs need to revisit charter with new template. Jim reported that there are three clubs left to finish chartering process. Blue Ribbon club still has no leaders, would like to see this club continue under new leadership rather than dissolving the club, as we need community clubs for new 4-H members.



4-H activities are possible due to volunteers in Johnson County! The JC 4-H program always has a place for caring adults to help out!

Adults 19 years year may apply to become a certified UW 4-H volunteer and can enroll at any time of the year.

As a certified UW 4-H volunteer, an adult can serve in a variety of educational and organizational roles that provide quality, positive 4-H youth development programs for youth. Roles include:

Project volunteer

Coach

Club volunteer

Activity volunteer

Member of 4-H committees or 4-H councils

Chaperones (must be at least 21 years of age)

To achieve **UW certified volunteer status, adults must** complete the following process:

Submit an enrollment application through 4-HOnline. (<u>https://wy.4hOnline.com</u>). Complete and successfully pass the UW background check every five years.

*4-H volunteers returning to 4-H after a year or more break in service must successfully pass the screening process.

Participate in the 4-H Volunteer Certification Training.

To continue volunteer service, volunteers must receive training at least every five years that will benefit the volunteer's role in the 4-H program.

Adult volunteers should not have one-on-one contact with 4-H members in private settings. Volunteers should not have direct electronic contact, including social media, with an individual youth unless it is for educational or programmatic purposes.

Chaperoning Overnight Stays

All 4-H sponsored youth activities that involve overnight stays must be supervised by a minimum of two designated certified adults.

During overnight events, there should be a 2:20 ratio of adults to youth.

Chaperones for overnight stays must be at least 21 years of age.

Chaperones shall not share sleeping quarters with 4-H members.

Chaperones shall not share bathrooms, locker rooms, or showers with 4-H members.

4-H chaperones must complete additional 4-H training.

All shooting sports and horse-related events, competitions, and or activities must be directly supervised by a certified 4-H volunteer who has received additional UW 4-H training from the state 4-H program for the discipline, event, competition or activity being supervised.

Elizabeth Conklin successful in the 2017 Wyoming 4-H Deer Hunt.



Elizabeth Conklin is a Johnson County 4-H senior, set to graduate this year from BHS, and has a wide variety of interests, one of which is shooting. In 4-H Shooting Sports, Elizabeth has been active in many shooting sports disciplines, took hunter education with the 4-H group, competes in the County and State 4-H Shoots (where she won the ultimate prize of traveling with the state development team to the NRA Whittington Center in Raton, NM). She also was selected to hunt with longtime 4-H shooting sports development team leader Bob Sexton, 4-H Foundation Director Steve Mack, and WGFD Commissioner Mike Schmid.

The WY State 4-H Program offers a hunting experience for up to six youth ages 14-18. The hunt takes place in Northeastern WY on the Solitude Ranch.

The ranch is located 5 miles east of Devils Tower and features spectacular scenery and lots of wildlife. The hunt is primarily for whitetail doe deer and so far has a 98% success rate and 100% opportunity to harvest.

All 4-H members between 14 and 18 years of age are eligible. Applications will evaluated by a selection committee with preference given to first time hunters and 4-H shooting sports members enrolled in the rifle, pistol, shotgun, archery, muzzle loading, wildlife and/or hunting projects.

Wysing 4-H W/EXTENSION

How do I get started in Johnson County (JC) 4-H?

We in the JC University of Wyoming Extension (UWE) Office are always excited to help those interested in joining 4-H. 4-H is open to all youth of JC ages 8-18, as of January 1st of the current 4-H year, with the 4-H year October 1 - September 30. Members may enroll at any time of the year, although some projects have deadlines.

The UWE office is located at 30 Fairgrounds Road in Buffalo with office hours from 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. and is closed over the noon hour. (summer7:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.). The 4-H office phone number is 684-7522, so call or stop by for help with 4-H related questions.

The steps to become a new 4-H youth member in Johnson County are:

Step 1: All 4-H enrollment starts online via <u>https://wyoming.4honline.com</u>, by creating a family profile and selecting project areas from over 40 areas. Upon enrollment a member will receive notification from the state 4-H office, a monthly newsletter, and JC email updates.

Step 2: During 4Honline enrollment, members will be asked to choose a club or select club placement requested. Please do not hesitate to call the UWE office or contact a club leader to see if a club is full or would be a good fit. There are currently 12 JC community clubs and all youth in JC 4-H must be a member of one of these clubs. Each Club's structure varies but all must adhere to Wyoming 4-H Policy. (Youth may be a club member of 4-H in only one state and one county at any time).

Step 3: Upon enrollment and club placement the community club leaders will receive notification of any new member in the club. They invite new members to upcoming club meetings and events. Picking Apples

How many times has your mom sent you to go pick 6 apples and bag them while grocery shopping at Wal-Mart? Do you sort through and find the biggest? Or maybe you sort through and find the ones with the most red, fewest soft spots, firmest, smallest? Whatever it may be, you without knowing it have an idea of what that perfect apple should look like. Well, when you show and market a livestock animal at the Johnson County Fair the buyers at the Junior Livestock Sale are doing the same thing, they are picking apples. Some might like more fat, some might like bigger, or smaller or leaner; all have a different preference. The goal of the Ultrasound Carcass Contest is to educate kids, parents, public and anyone really that wants educated about the product they are producing and marketing at the Johnson County Fair.

Last year was the first year for the Ultrasound Carcass Contest at the Johnson County Fair. With a few bumps and some things we would like to improve upon, the first year went relatively smooth. This year we would like to better the carcass contest and try to add in a beginning weight and a final weight on the animals. By doing this it will help us compute and figure in the average daily gain (pounds gained per day). The average daily gain number becomes extremely important to those producers in the commercial industry who are not marketing one market beef but 500 market beef and are trying to get them to their final weight the fastest. The hope is to teach kids the importance of not only carcass quality for the product they are providing to consumers (buyers at the Johnson County Livestock Sale), but also the importance of feed efficiency since, after all they are the ones paying for the feed bill. The kids will be able to figure out how much it cost them to put on a pound of gain, which when multiplied out on the commercial operation turns into a very important aspect. A beginning weight will be recorded at the mandatory tagging locations. So our beef tagging on January 21st will be the first location to record that introductory weight needed for the Ultrasound Carcass Contest.

The second new thing we are going to try to implement this year is an educational seminar put on by Wit Stewart, the UW Sheep Specialist and Steve Paisley, the UW Beef Specialist. Our goal is to get these two to come to Johnson County this winter and invite all the youth and parents who wish to learn more. They will be able to teach us about carcass quality, all the numbers they pulled last year when the animals were ultra-sounded and just what all those numbers mean. A date and time will be announced once it is finalized with Wit and Steve. We will advertise that date, time and location through the 4-H online email system.
