

#### Dear Johnson County 4-H Community:

February is a short month but we in 4-H sure pack a lot into it. Shooting sports indoor sessions, sport fishing, Fabric and Fashion workshop, committee, council and club meetings, leader trainings, both face to face and via zoom, and the third annual CPES 4-H Project EXPO kept Johnson County 4-H highlighted on many family calendars.

On Feb 8th, over 40 youth and adult volunteers teamed up to conduct a 4-H Project Expo at Cloud Peak Elementary School (CPES). This was the third year to work with Principal Anderson on conducting the Expo and the current 5th graders have been introduced to 15 different project areas over the last three years. The three Expo's have been a win-win day for CPES school staff and students, as well as the JC 4-H community. Sessions on small and large critters, judging, fashion and fabric, foods, entomology, and crafts with upwards of 300 students in grades 3-5th. This audience is the perfect demographic to get introduced to JC 4-H. Many students went home thinking about all the fun they could have if they joined 4-H. Our passionate and dedicated volunteers—shared their knowledge, skills, and enthusiasm for these project areas sparking an interest in both those that knew a lot or those that just knew a little of what 4-H in JC has to offer. Fun, engaging activities lead by caring adults with generous community support is what we have in JC 4-H!

At the Feb 18<sup>th</sup> Northeast area 4-H Educators meeting, the state 4-H staff provided educators in the NE counties an update including data for enrollments and retention percentages from throughout the state tabulated since 2000. The JC data was extremely encouraging. JC 4-H in 2018 experienced their largest county enrollment numbers since this data was collected. JC 4-H also witnessed the largest percentage of county school-aged kids in the entire state with 31% of our school-aged kids enrolled in our program. With recruitment and retention being a priority for national and state 4-H leadership, we in JC are making it happen. There are many contributing factors but my premise is that we gain new members and keep these new ones for subsequent years by the overall quality and volume of work conducted by our volunteer leaders. Caring adult leaders who fully engage youth in club and project activities is the single most important ingredient that is growing the JC 4-H program. I, the state 4-H office staff, and the JC 4-H Council need to thank our adult volunteers more often. I sure look forward to reporting these numbers to the Johnson County Commissioners!

Volunteering is how things get done in 4-H and a big thank you goes out to each and every volunteer that helped make the 4-H Project Expo at CPES a success. Special thanks to CPES Principal Craig Anderson and the 4-H Council Executive Board for seeing the value of doing this Expo on an annual basis.

The JC 4-H Carnival Committee is currently working hard to make the 2019 Carnival a success. Please do not forget to thank those involved in carnival committee work and as well as those supporting 4-H by purchasing raffle tickets. I sincerely thank each Johnson County volunteer, youth and adult alike, for making the JC 4-H program a source of community pride. 4-H continues to grow in Johnson County!

### "Head to Clearer Thinking" Recognition for Club Work in Educational Programming

At each meeting, we say the 4-H pledge, making a pledge of our heads to clearer thinking. A large part of your 4-H experience is learning and life skill development. One way this can be done is through club educational programming. An education program could be having member do demonstrations, inviting in guest speakers, taking a club tour, or using your club to share new ideas and learning experience in a variety of ways. Your imagination is the only thing limiting how clubs spend time learning.

In support of club work in educational programming, the Wyoming 4-H Foundation is offering \$200 awards for 5 clubs who are learning and growing through educational programs. The grants will be based on quantity of programs, diversity, creativity, innovation, and participation.

#### How does it work?

- Clubs will be asked to share educational programs they offer or engage in, as a club. Programs
  planned by the county would not be considered for this award. If a club chooses to partner with
  another club or organization to provide club members with a new learning experience, this can be
  included. The programs should not be for select members of the club (ex. Beef project members only)
  but rather the entire club membership.
- Sharing of the information can be done in a variety of ways. Clubs can turn in paper applications for each event completed, upload their information to a closed Facebook group, or complete an online application through Formstack. The State 4-H Office will compile all submissions, no matter what method is used.
- 3. Awards will be given based on educational programs that run from October 1, 2018 September 20, 2019.
- 4. Applications can be turned in at any time throughout the year.
- 5. Qualifying applications are due to the State 4-H Office by November 1, 2019.

What information are we asking you to share about the community service experience?

- 1. Club Name and County
- 2. A photo (if available) of the experience.
- 3. A title for the educational program.
- 4. Who presented the information?
- 5. A brief description of the learning that occurred.

### "Hands to Larger Service" Recognition for Club Work in Community Service

This work cannot be events or activities planned at the county level, but rather those that are part of a yearly club program. If a club chooses to partner with a different club or organization, this type of work can be included.
- Sharing of the information can be done in a variety of ways. Clubs can turn in paper applications for each event completed, upload their information to a closed Facebook group, or complete an online application through Formstack. The State 4-H Office will compile all submissions, no matter what method is used.
- 3. Awards will be given based on community service projects that run from October 1, 2018 September 20, 2019.
- 4. Applications can be turned in at any time throughout the year.
- 5. Qualifying applications are due to the State 4-H Office by November 1, 2019.
