To the Johnson County 4-H Community,

Many seem to think the 4-H Executive Council, Committees and Extension office might be able to breathe a little before the new 4-H year begins but as always September sees of flurry of post fairs catch ups and new year 4-H planning activities. October kicks off the new 4-H year and along with evaluations of the 2017-2018 4-H year, the club chartering process begins. Our Johnson County 4-H Council is constantly working on ways to improve community clubs, service work, and project learning ensuring the 4-H youth of Johnson County have the best possible 4-H experience. Working with our Executive 4-H Council and Committee members is how it gets done and it is good fun!

At the end of this month (Monday October 29th), I plan to conduct a round table meeting with our community club leaders to address common areas of concern and build a larger pool of project area leaders. With the variety of project areas offered, the JC 4-H program is always needing caring adults to serve as project area leaders. A testament to the work of our adult leaders is observed in the quality of youth exhibits showcased at the county and state fairs. Exhibits were of high quality, with the WSF superintendents commenting on how well JC youth do and to the pile of rosettes brought back to Johnson County!

During the 2018 4-H year, all community clubs were required to update and align their club bylaws using the state 4-H template. These updated bylaws ensure all clubs are operating under a common standard with positive youth development as the driving force. Club bylaws will be reviewed during the upcoming renewal process. The renewal of clubs via chartering, along with leader and youth re-enrollments should be on every club leaders list of things to do in October or November. All in 4-H need to realize we must adhere to established state 4-H policies, especially requirements pertaining to leader certification and financial accountability. Remember to go to 4Honline on Oct 1st to keep current for upcoming club meetings, activities and bank signature card changes!

Johnson County 4-H Council Meeting Minutes

September 10, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 6:35 pm in Buffalo at the Community Building. See attached sign-in sheet for those in attendance. Hayden Geis led the Pledge of Allegiance and Hannah Qualm led the 4-H pledge.

CLUB REPORTS

*No club reports were requested.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

A quick summary of the July meeting minutes as written by Secretary Cristie Murray were presented by President Amanda Monterastelli. Teresa Bessler moved to approve the July meeting minutes, Hayden Geis seconded, motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Kami Kennedy reported the following balances for the 4-H Council: Checking - \$30,738.98, Wyoming 4-H Foundation - \$29,068.14, Endowment - \$10,000.00, and Scholarship \$21,729.32. The treasurer's report included balances for the following: Livestock Judging - \$1,710.96, Shooting Sports - \$8,222.85, 4-H @ Work - \$2,921.25. Monthly expenses totaled \$6,682.58 and monthly income totaled \$300.00. Becky Qualm made a motion to approve the treasurer's report, Hayden Geis seconded, motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

A document was handed out for discussion which listed items to consider for next year's County Fair. *Adri Ruby expressed the need for the displaying of static exhibits to be done differently starting next year, as the past two years, only a couple of people have come to help display the static exhibits. She suggested: 1.) Have 4-H clubs display their own exhibits in the exhibit hall (Community Building), or 2.) One club is assigned each year to set up the exhibit hall.*

Programs: Amanda Monterastelli, cake decorating leader, reported that the kids did not do as well at State Fair as she had expected, but received good feedback from state judges for next year's projects. Others expressed good representation at State Fair in static exhibit projects, Sheep, Livestock Judging, and Fabric and Fashion.

Publicity: Buffalo Bulletin was recognized for inclusion of 4-H Activities in the paper recently. Amanda Monterastelli again presented the idea of creating an insert at the UWE 4-H Extension Office to be placed in the Buffalo Bulletin with County Fair results. Teresa Bessler made a motion to include approximately \$400 in next year's 4-H Council budget to print the 2019 County Fair results (including printing costs at the UWE 4-H Extension Office) for an insert in the Buffalo Bulletin immediately following County Fair. Sophia Conklin seconded, motion carried.

Fundraising: Spurs & Lace 4-H Club fundraiser September 23, 2018. Idea and sample brought to council meeting for any club/entity to sell Butter Braid Danish - \$15 (inquiries to 4-H Office). The 4-H Carnival was discussed for 2019 and potential dates and venues were considered. Friday, March 15, and Friday, March 22, 2019 were both potential dates and location of Buffalo High School was suggested for venue. Jim will begin coordinating with BHS to reserve the school for one of these dates.

Awards & Recognition: The chairs/duffels given out to Grand and Reserve Champions at County Fair were well received. Dates again were considered for Achievement Night and looking at potentially higher conflicts on suggested dates, October 22nd was suggested and will be firmed up this week.

Livestock Committee: Sale = \$408,000 on 175 livestock animals.

Junior Leaders: County Fair – movie night was well-attended; water fight cancelled due to weather. Other state 4-H opportunity at UW football game on Saturday, September 15th.

Special Committees: Jim Dawson and others present emphasized that committees are not just two people! We need more committee involvement, and as a new 4-H year is about to start as of October 1, please sign up to serve on a committee.

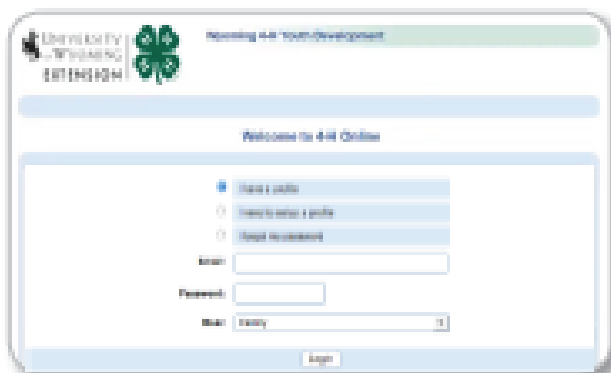

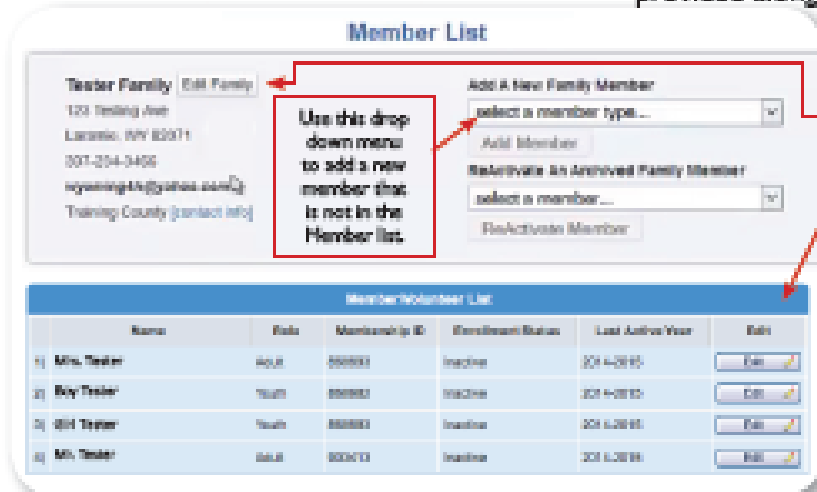

2. As an existing Member/Family that is re-enrolling for the next 4-H year select the first option I have a profile
 - Enter your email address and password you used to create your Family login and click the **LOGIN** button
 - If you can't remember your password select I forgot my password enter your email address and click the **Send My Password** button.
 - A new automated password will be sent to the email address you provided along with instructions to login and reset your password.

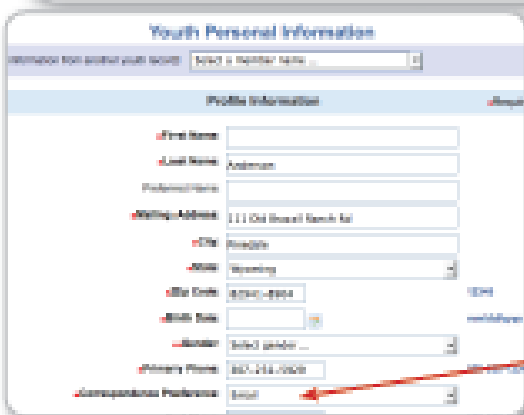


3. Once you are logged in you can review your Family info and update it if needed by clicking the **Edit Family** button

- At the Bottom of the page on the right you will click the **Enroll for 2015-2016** button.

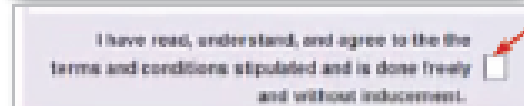

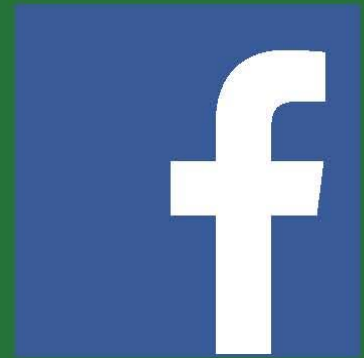

Volunteer Leadership Roles

As an approved Wyoming 4-H Volunteer you can take on a variety of roles in the 4-H program.

Project Volunteer - Coordinates and teaches members within a specific project area, such as photography, foods, or beef. 4-H volunteer project leaders are the "backbone" of 4-H.

Club Volunteer - Provides overall 4-H club leadership. Also coordinates members, parents, and the involvement of other leaders. 4-H Club Leaders can be an individual, a team, or a group of people that have specific roles that fulfill the 4-H Club Leader responsibilities.

Activity Volunteer - Directs activities, such as fund raising, recreation, community service, and promotion. Members learn through involvement in the activity.

Coach – Coordinate and teaches members who are planning to participate in a contest or event.

Committee Member – The 4-H program runs well when much of the work is done by committees of youth and adults who have interest in a particular area. As an approved volunteer you can serve as a voting member or in leadership of a committee to help plan a particular part of the 4-H program. A committee member might also be a volunteer who serves on a 4-H council in an advisory role to assist the 4-H educator in providing the 4-H experience. A County 4-H Council or Advisory group helps to fundraise, advocates for the 4-H program, can coordinate county level events, and overall supports the 4-H work in the county. The County Council does not serve in a policy making role.

Chaperone – Many of our events require our youth to stay overnight, like camps, contests, and trips. We have very strict policies for those volunteers staying overnight with you. Adults who chaperone:

- Must be 21 years of age or older.
- Need to participate in an additional chaperone specific training.
- There should be at least 2 deep leadership at overnight events.
- The Wyoming 4-H program requires at a 1:10 adult to youth ratio at all 4-H events.



4-H Council Committee Descriptions



All Committees:

- Report to the 4-H Council at each regular meeting
- Work with other committees to accomplish work when needed

Publicity Committee:

- Write stories about upcoming and past events and submit to local media outlets to increase public awareness of 4-H activities
- Keep and compile memorabilia of activities throughout the year
- Plan and implement activities for National 4-H Week, which is in early October, for all clubs to participate in
- Work with 4-H Council to establish a working budget for the committee, and then work within this budget

Fundraising Committee:

- Understand 4-H Council funding needs and budget requirements
- Plan fundraising activities to be completed by committee members, volunteers and youth to meet financial needs annually
- Work with 4-H Council to establish a working budget for the committee, and then work within this budget

Programs Committee:

- Work with 4-H Educator, project leaders, and other volunteers and youth to determine program needs in the county
- Design and implement programs that foster positive youth development, working with the 4-H Educator, project leaders, and other volunteers and youth in the county
- Work with 4-H Council to establish a working budget for the committee, and then work within this budget

Awards & Recognition Committee:

- Understand the 4-H Recognition Model, and utilize this model to determine a variety of methods to recognize youth and adults
- Determine appropriate times to recognize work of youth and adults throughout the program year, and provide awards at these times
- Work with 4-H Council to establish a working budget for the committee, and then work within this budget

The 4-H Council Vice **President** and **Secretary** shall serve a two year term. Officers are eligible to succeed themselves in the same leadership position, not to exceed two consecutive terms unless the position cannot be filled.

Officer nominations may be made by any JC 4-H member but shall become official upon receipt of the Officer Nomination Application by the UWE Office by the due date.

- **Nominations are due by Oct 19th with elections conducted on Achievement Night Oct 22nd.**
- A majority of all votes cast is necessary to elect any officer.

2018-2019 4-H CLUB CHARTERING

All Johnson County 4-H clubs must renew their club charters at the start of the new 4-H year shortly after October 1st. Chartering is the process by which a group is recognized as an official 4-H club by the UWE. Upon meeting established requirements, a charter is presented to the new 4-H club. Failure to meet club chartering requirements and/or leader certification may *result in the loss of the charter or restrictions placed upon a club*. As of the January 11th 2016, 4-H Council meeting, the motion carried whereby clubs failing to complete chartering prior to December 15th be fined \$100.

4-H Clubs must be officially chartered through the University of Wyoming Extension (UWE) with the 4-H educator responsible for guiding the community club leaders and directing the process.

The established requirements for a 4-H club charter:

1. A membership of at least five 4-H members from at least two separate families.
2. 4-H club leaders must maintain their UWE 4-H certification active status with a screened volunteer leader to supervise the organizational needs and programs of the club, two are recommended.
3. An appropriately structured club utilizing a leadership team of elected youth officers.
4. The club and volunteers from the club must be prepared to support the 4-H program above the local club level, i.e. participation in county 4-H council meetings or county development committees.
5. A calendar of planned educational activities (i.e. meetings, workshops, community service, etc.).
6. Create 4-H club bylaws using the state 4-H template (newly adopted by the state 4-H office in 2017).
7. Adherence to JC 4-H Council bylaws.
8. Approval of application by the county UWE 4-H educator.
9. If the club anticipates raising funds, generating income, or having bank accounts, an Employer Identification Number /Tax Identification Number (EIN/TIN) is a requirement of the IRS.

Each year 4-H clubs shall be evaluated and approved for renewal to continue operating as an official JC community club for the upcoming 4-H year. The following information should be collected for evaluation and renewal:

- The Wyoming 4-H Club Treasurer's Handbook (new in 2017)
 - Audit by internal committee (adopted in 2017 with four clubs per year for a three year cycle)
 - Working with the 4-H Educator for timely submission of the IRS Form
- The Wyoming 4-H Club Secretary Handbook with club minutes(new in 2017)
- Updated Club Charter Application
