SECRETARY'S REPORT

Secretary Cristie Murray did not read the minutes of the April meeting as they were published for review in the May Clover Chatter. Lance Rabel moved to approve the April meeting minutes as published in the Clover Chatter, Sophia Conklin seconded, motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPO

Kami Kennedy reported the following balances for the 4-H Council: Checking - \$35,360.42, Wyoming 4-H Foundation - \$28,827.96, Endowment - \$10,000.00, and Scholarship \$21,729.32. The treasurer's report included balances for the following: Livestock Judging - \$2,939.91, Shooting Sports - \$2,449.12, 4-H @ Work - \$2,569.25. Expenses totaled \$786.92 and approximately \$2,500 in donations has come in for 4-H income. Adri Ruby made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, Kari Malson seconded, motion carried. Shooting sports leaders Sophia and Don Conklin provided bank reconciliation statements to Kami Kennedy, and requested funds from the 4-H Council account that were allocated to the shooting sports project this calendar year be transferred to the shooting sports checking account. Sophia Conklin also requested the issuance of a debit card for the shooting sports account for purchases. Adri Ruby made a motion to issue a debit card for shooting sports, Elise Rose seconded, motion carried.

<u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u> Jim and the 4-H Council would like to establish a lead or chairperson for each program/committee to be able to communicate what is happening.





CLASSES

IDENTIFICATION LINE

The latest revision of the "4-H Produce Identification List" will be the authority to determine which products are used for identification.

- Seniors will identify 30 products;
- Juniors and Intermediates will identify 20.

Scoring will be based on properly identifying vegetables by either the general classifications or the specific variety correct for that item. Deductions will not be made for spelling errors.





JOHNSON COUNTY FAIR BOARD POLICY

The Johnson County (JC) Fair Board and Livestock Committee continually strives to provide the safest environment possible for all 4-H and FFA livestock brought onto the Fairgrounds. To ensure the best facility for our youth exhibitors to house their livestock and achieve this goal the JC Fair Board and Livestock Committee has established the following changes to our health policy. This motion and vote passed at the February 6th 2018 Livestock Committee meeting with implementation at the 2018 JC Fair.

Biosecurity is the implementation of measures to prevent the introduction of disease into a healthy population of animals or limit the spread of disease once introduced.

Our animal biosecurity is primarily designed on minimizing the risk of serious disease, with that being said the Fair Board cannot guarantee there will be no animal health issues. There is always a risk when bringing livestock to town but the Fair Board and Livestock Committee hopes these steps will help minimize the risks.

The most important steps to ensure healthy animals start at home, so please if you feel you have a sick animal do not bring it to the Fairgrounds and work with your superintendent and a veterinarian to ensure your animal is healthy.

During weigh-ins there will be a veterinarian onsite to inspect any animal a superintendent suspects may have a health issue. The Fair Board will also require all 4-H or FFA breeding animals, along with open class animals, to check in at the appropriate species weigh-in station to be inspected. There will be a walk through by a veterinarian on Monday (July 30th) evening also as an additional safety check. The Fair Board will also have a veterinarian on call throughout Fair week if any animal health issues arise.


