From the AG Desk

The **poinsettia** is an icon of the winter holiday season. The classic green and red plants brighten up any room. They do best in places with bright light and if they are allowed to dry out between waterings.

Donna and I were recently discussing her potted poinsettia that lives at the Extension office. It sits on the kitchen table and gets light exposure from the sliding glass door to the west. How old do you think Donna's poinsettia is? (Answer given below!) It turns out they can make good houseplants if you don't give up on them in the New Year.

If you have a **4-Her interested in gardening or horticulture projects**, houseplants can be an easy place to start. They provide an opportunity to learn about the responsibility of caring for another living thing (a good way to work up to a puppy, bum lamb, or bottle calf), and I think they are just plain fun to watch grow. Reach out to the Extension office if you would like more information on growing houseplants or on the Gardening & Horticulture 4-H project area.

Poinsettia production is big business in California, and there are plenty of opportunities for careers in the consumer horticulture industry here in Wyoming. Just because it doesn't look like the agriculture we are familiar with doesn't mean it isn't agriculture.

Finally, if you find yourself in possession of a poinsettia this December, check out "Saving Poinsettias for Next Year" on the UWyoExtension YouTube page to learn how to keep the blooms coming.

P.S. If you live on a ranch, make sure to tell your parents that poinsettias are in the same family as leafy spurge (*Euphorbiaceae*). They aren't going to invade your pasture, though, so you can enjoy them in peace.

- b.In the black drop-down menu to the left, select Print/Submit Project
- c. You can review the record book, and if there are no changes to be made, download/print/or submit that file.
- d. Repeat this process for all other record books and 4-H involvement for each member when it is time to turn them in or if you would like them saved to your computer.
