To the Johnson County 4-H Community,

As I prepare my end of the year report to the County Commissioners regarding the JC 4-H program, I am reminded that JC 4-Hers learned, had fun, and experienced many successes at the county and state levels. We rose to new heights with enrollment and numbers for youth involved rose to 326 members. All the opportunities provided to youth that happen in our program can be attributed to the support from a generous community and tremendous commitment to youth development by our 4-H Executive Council, 4-H Committees. From the AG Desk

Home on the Range: The Range Management Project Area

Here in Johnson County, many of us are at Home on the Range, but did you know that WY 4-H has a Range Management project area? This is what Wyoming 4-H has to say about it: "Wyoming has a vast array of rangeland to explore. This project allows you to study rangeland types and how/where they grow. You can learn more about the habitat and nutritional resources rangelands provide for livestock and wildlife." Some people think that prairies and grassland ecosystems are empty and boring, but the opposite couldn't be more true—they are full of life and perform important functions like feeding animals and catching rainwater!

Whether you spend your whole summer looking forward to deer and antelope hunting in the fall or you are busy helping around the ranch with cattle and sheep chores, you probably already know a little bit about range science. Ruminant livestock and wildlife can do a pretty neat trick—they can eat grass and other plants humans can't eat and they thrive. If we tried to live on grass alone, things wouldn't go so well for us. (Ask Micahif you really want to nerd out on the science of why this is the case.)

Several **project ideas** in the Range Management area include learning about the ruminant digestive system and making a display that explains it to others or learning the parts of different range plants and building a field notebook to collect and label specimens. You might even want to help your favorite rancher take range forage clippings and make a report on your findings!

Skills gained in this area can be used in a future career as a rancher, a range scientist, a conservationist, a hunting guide, or even as an Extension educator. Let Bryce know if you are interested in trying out a new project in the **Range Management** area!




