



#### From the AG Desk

What's the Buzz?

Many of our economically important crops like alfalfa, almonds, and apples depend on pollination by insects. Honeybees are important pollinators, but they are not endangered. "Save the bees" is better used when discussing our native pollinators. The Ag Educator Micah is working with Johnson Co. 4-H Council to provide honeybee project opportunities—stay tuned for future information!

#### Pollinator fun facts

- Honeybees (Apis mellifera) are not native to the United States
- Many native bees in WY are solitary and live alone in burrows in the ground
- The **squash bee** (*Peponapis pruinosa*) is native to North American and specializes in pollinating summer squash, pumpkins, melons, and cucumbers—sometimes these bees even take naps inside the flower
- Leaving some fallen leaves and plant litter in yards and gardens in the fall helps native bees survive the winter by providing habitat
- Hummingbirds are attracted to red, tube-shaped flowers
- A person who studies insects is called an **entomologist**

#### 4-H Entomology (Insect) Project Area Ideas

- Make a field book to track insect observations in your yard or in a park
- Plan a pollinator garden
- Show how body shape relates to function using clay models
- Describe an insect life cycle on a poster




#### **Shooting Sports for June and July.**



Spotted Knapweed— A biennial weed with a large tap root that spreads primarily by seeds. Highly invasive and prefers dry, gravelly sites.



Houndstongue— A biennial weed that forms small "nutlets" that stick to everything including bare skin. Often found in large patches along trails.



Mullein— Large tap root biennial that reproduces by seed. Invasive on disturbed soils and well-drained rocky soils.



Orange Hawkweed— a nonnative perennial recognized by it's bright redorange flowers. It can invade pastures and grasslands.



Oxeye Dalsy—An erect rhizomatous perennial with a creeping root system that can grow 1-3ft tall. It is an aggressive invasive species that can spread via seeds and rhizomes.

Program Sponsored by: Johnson County Weed & Pest, Clear Creek Conservation District, Powder River Conservation District, Natural Resources Conservation Service, Wyoming Game & Fish Department, US Forest Service, Bureau of Land Management, Buffalo Trails Board, and the Johnson County UW Extension.

#### WEED BOUNTY PROGRAM

Program runs mid-May—July. Johnson County Weed and Pest will pay \$0.50 per pound for spotted knapweed, houndstounge and mullien and will pay \$0.75 for oxeye daisy and orange hawkweed. There are a



few rules: Weigh in/payments, bags and program details can be picked up May-July during business hours 7:00-12:00 and 1:00-4:00 Mon-Fri at JCW&P. Weeds must be bagged in clear bags supplied by JCW&P. No payments will be made for plants collected in any other bag. Plants will be weighed; checks will be written at the end of the pull season. There is a \$50 reward for verified new locations of ventenata or medusahead grasses. The top three pullers will receive an additional prize: 1st Place: \$100; 2nd Place: \$50; 3rd Place: \$30.




#### LILY CRAGO


