Last night the Johnson County Livestock Committee met. Below you will find a few important notes regarding the upcoming Johnson County Fair. Please be aware of the changes below as you prepare for this year's fair. - Bryce McKenzie

| Commission Reduction Requirements | Steps to Reduce Your Sale Commission from 8% to 2% First year sellers - Attend the required first year sellers meeting, complete buyer packet requirements, attend the mandatory meeting at Johnson County Fair (Monday), and complete a Youth Quality Assurance in the year of selling. Any Other Sellers - Complete buyer's packet, attend the mandatory meeting at the Johnson County Fair (Monday), Complete a Youth Quality Assurance in the year of selling. CHANGES: All youth are now required to complete a Youth Quality Assurance. We are using YQCA (Youth for the Quality Care of Animals). Bryce will provide three different classes, all in one-hour lengths. One for Senior age, one for Intermediate ages, and one for Junior ages. Junior ages class will follow the first-year sellers meeting. |

Some requirements are outlined however, please see below: One family animal is allowed per household, only allowed in one species, the family members eligible to show this animal must be completing the same species, the household must declare who is showing the family animal before any of the household animals may be weighed in. As of right now, this animal would not be eligible for Wyoming State Fair, however, Wyoming State Fair is in discussion currently about allowing Family Animals to exhibit. |

| Goat Rule | The Wyoming State Fair in 2025 currently will not allow market goats to have horns. |
| Changes | The livestock Committee discussed and voted to have a rule that allows youth to show horned goats in the youth market show at the Johnson County Fair, with the knowledge they may not be eligible to show at Wyoming State Fair. Wyoming State Fair Show Committee This committee met and is currently in discussion about allowing horned does to be shown at Wyoming State Fair. We will see what the decision of the committee is within the coming weeks. |



County youth ages 15 to 18 gain life skills such as interviewing, resume writing, job

Performance and responsibility with an internship.

The intern will have the opportunity to observe, learn, and participate with the employee of their choice. The hope is through the internship, the intern can find a career that they may pursue after high school.

Interns will experience as many aspects of their chosen career as possible and work with their employer to learn skills necessary for the job. The professional work force of the intern's choice may be welding, accounting, retail, banking, law, carpentry, and the list goes on. The intern is required to work 100 hours between May 1, 2024 and March 1, 2025. Once time-sheets, evaluation forms from employer and intern are turned in to the Johnson County Extension Office (by 03/01/2025) a stipend of \$1,200 will be issued to the intern with no cost to the employer.

This opportunity is available only to Johnson County youth enrolled in 4-H.

How to Apply

Step 1: Think of a career you would like to learn more about through real-life

experiences.

Step 2: Contact a professional or business owner in this field and inquire if they would be interested in having an intern work for them for 100 hours at NO cost to them.

Step 3: Fill out the application, resume, and other required application materials. These may be picked up at the Johnson County Extension Office (30 Fairgrounds Rd Buffalo WY).
