Treasurer's Report: Lesley Pearson reported the following balances for the 4-H Council: Checking - \$66,239.49; Wyoming 4-H Foundation - \$39,196.13, 4-H @ Work - \$365.25. The Treasurer's Report included balances for Livestock Judging - \$9.84; Shooting Sports Checking - \$8,229.50; Shooting Sports Savings - \$83,929.95; for a total Checking and Savings amount of \$197,970.16. Monthly expenses were \$24,990.90 and monthly income was \$61,774.40. Laney Mader made a motion to accept the treasurer's report, Corbin Camino seconded the motion. The motion passed.


## **New Business**



Performance and responsibility with an internship.

The intern will have the opportunity to observe, learn, and participate with the employee of their choice. The hope is through the internship, the intern can find a career that they may pursue after high school.

Interns will experience as many aspects of their chosen career as possible and work with their employer to learn skills necessary for the job. The professional work force of the intern's choice may be welding, accounting, retail, banking, law, carpentry, and the list goes on. The intern is required to work 100 hours between May 1, 2025 and March 1, 2026. Once time-sheets, evaluation forms from employer and intern are turned in to the Johnson County Extension Office (by 03/01/2026 a stipend of \$1,200 will be issued to the intern with no cost to the employer.

This opportunity is available only to Johnson County youth enrolled in 4-H.

### **How to Apply**

Step 1: Think of a career you would like to learn more about through real-life experiences.

Step 2: Contact a professional or business owner in this field and inquire if they would be interested in having an intern work for them for 100 hours at NO cost to them.

Step 3: Fill out the application, resume, and other required application materials. These may be picked up at the Johnson County Extension Office (30 Fairgrounds Rd Buffalo WY).
