3. Place tag with number on the back of the pig's ear (exception: if the pig has floppy ears & the eye will get scratched by the post).
4. Upload animal information and required pictures to 4HOnline
Swine: 1. Picture of tag in ear, 2. left side & 3. right side.

SHEEP/GOATS

1. Bring a copy of the Form A Brand Inspection to tagging.
2. Upload animal information and required pictures to 4HOnline
Sheep: 1. Picture of tag in ear & 2. Entire animal.
Goat: 1. Picture of tag in ear & 2. Entire animal.

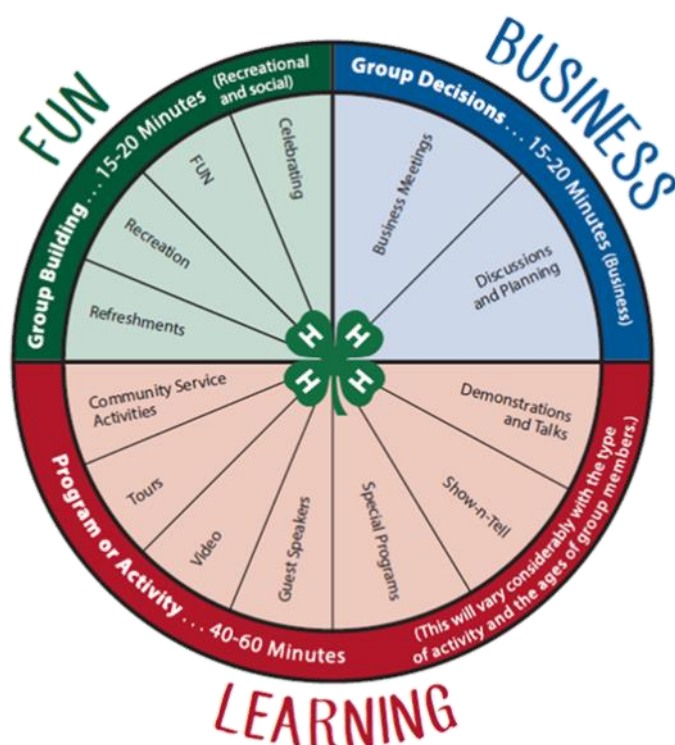

2019 Fair Changes (so far)

Date—August 3-10, 2019

Theme — Just a Small Town Throwdown

Market Livestock—Livestock must be tagged by ownership dates: Beef-Feb. 1; Sheep/Goats-June 1; Swine-June 1.

Fair Entry Deadline—June 1-July 31, 2019

Large Livestock Fees—The fee will be \$20 per animal.

Trailer Camping Fees—\$25/night for 4-H participants & \$35/night for public.

4-H/FFA Horse Show Team Sorting—Exhibitors will compete one time only unless there is an odd number of participants. The exhibitor who goes twice will only take their first score.

Animal Health Certificates—All market animals, horses, dogs, etc. need to have a current health certificate to present at fair.

Weigh-in Scales—Scales will be open for 30 minutes after last animal has weighed-in.

Sale Checks—Livestock sale checks must be cashed before 60 days after the check issue date. If not, the participant must attend a fair board meeting to ask for the check to be re-issued. A re-issue fee of \$50 will be charged.

State Veterinarian emphasizes poultry import requirements in light of virulent Newcastle disease case found in Utah

To come into Wyoming, all poultry and hatching eggs - including those coming in for exhibition - are required to have an Interstate Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (ICVI or health certificate) issued by an accredited veterinarian from the state of origin. These certificates are valid for 30 days.

More information on Wyoming's poultry import requirements can be obtained by calling the Wyoming Livestock Board headquarters in Cheyenne at 307-777-7515 or the Riverton field office at 307-857-4140.

Market Swine Identification and Tagging- 2015

The following steps will be taken in order to tag swine. Swine are not to be brought to the Sheepland tagging order. If you have questions please contact the Extension Office as soon as possible. All photos and/or tags must be submitted no later than 5pm on June 1, 2015. NO EXCEPTIONS.

- Provide Proof of Ownership.
 - You can scan and email a copy of your Bill of Sale or ownership paperwork to the Extension Office and we will mail you the requested number of tags.
 - You can bring your Bill of Sale to the Extension Office and pick up tags.

Note: You will receive one tag per animal.
- You will be responsible for tagging your animals.
 - Place tags in the ear with the number visible on the outside (back) of the ear and the tag button on the inside of the ear. Wait with your club or project leader for assistance or contact the Extension Office.
 - Tags can be checked out from the Extension Office but should not be shared between locations. Tags checked out will be distributed between check-outs.
 - Tags can also be purchased at meat livestock supply stores. Please return taggers as soon as possible because we have a limited number.
 - All tags must be accounted for. If you do not use all of your tags, the remaining ones must be returned to the Extension Office prior to June 1st at 5 pm. For example, if you request/pick up five tags and you only end up tagging four pigs, the extra tag must be returned.
- Take three (3) pictures per animal.
 - One picture of the left, full side of the animal.
 - One picture of the right, full side of the animal.
 - One picture of the animal with the ear and tag number clearly visible.
- Attach your photos and enter your swine project information below.

Notes: All tagging information must be submitted and/or tags returned to the County Extension Office no later than 5pm on June 1, 2015. NO EXCEPTIONS.

ADDING ANIMAL ENTRIES (MARKET/BREEDING)

- Once you are logged into <https://wy.4honline.com>, select the family member who will be showing the animal from the "Member List." Select the Animals/Livestock tab at the top of the page.
- Use the dropdown menu to select your animal (market/breeding) species and click "Add Animal." This will take you to the corresponding entry screen for your animal. Each species has different information that is needed.
- Please be sure to read and understand the information page.
NOTE: All information must be in the 4honline system by 5 pm of the ownership date. The program will automatically turn the option off after this time:

Beef—February 1
Sheep—June 1
Goats—June 1
Swine—June 1
- Fill in the information requested
- Select the view of the picture you are uploading (make sure the picture of the tag is READABLE).
- Don't forget to SAVE!!!!

**** For Family Floater Animal—animals purchased as an extra incase someone in the family has one that dies—these can be transferred to another family member later ONLY if they are designated as a floater at the time of tagging. Please write the word FLOATER in the Animal Name field. The floater must be assigned to the family member whose name is on the bill of sale and/or Form A.

Check for Respect 4-H

The laughs gained with playing this game with your club can add some fun and give your club members the judgment to understand that the humor can be funny to listen to, but *not* funny if it is acted out. Some examples include:

- ◆ You feel a sneeze coming, so you
 - a) look for someone to sneeze on
 - b) cover your mouth and nose with your hands
 - c) turn your head away from

people and let the sneeze out as loudly as possible.

- ◆ Company is over. And you notice that after the meal, your mom has a big piece of lettuce on her tooth. You
 - a) point at it and start laughing as loud as you can,
 - b) ask if anyone can tell which of your mom's teeth is not like the other,
 - c) quietly whisper in your mom's ear that she

should check her teeth in the bathroom.

Once your 4-Her's understand the idea behind making up scenarios for the game, they will want to make up some of their own, too.

Now, when club members treat each other or possessions with respect, remember to say, "Check for respect."

It's "Thyme" to Garden

Hello Spring! It is that time of year when gardeners begin itching to plant, but for many in Wyoming, it is still too cold to start digging in the dirt. If you are one of those gardeners waiting for the ground to thaw or if you are an aspiring gardener wanting to take the first step, you can get started today by growing herbs inside. Herbs are easy to grow and provide wonderful flavor

to homemade meals. Here is how to start your own windowsill herb garden:

1. First, decide which herbs you want to grow. Basil, thyme, oregano, dill, and sage are easy to grow on a sunny windowsill.
2. Next, get a small pot for each herb. Make sure the pots have holes in the bottom for water to drain out. Place a saucer or plate under each pot to catch the extra water.
3. Plant each seed in potting soil or in a seed starting mixture. Make sure you check the seed packet to see how deep to plant the seeds.
4. Keep your soil moist, but not soggy. Add water when soil is dry to the touch, making sure to add just enough that water comes out of the bottom.
5. Set the pots in a sunny window that gets 5-6 hours of direct sunlight. Keep plants at least 6-12 inches from the window to protect them from extreme cold.
6. Use fertilizer every 4-8 weeks to help your plants grow.

Before you know it, you will have tasty herbs you can use for cooking in your own kitchen. For more gardening tips and tricks, check out the University of Wyoming publication on gardening:

Spicy Buffalo Grilled Chicken Sandwich or Salad

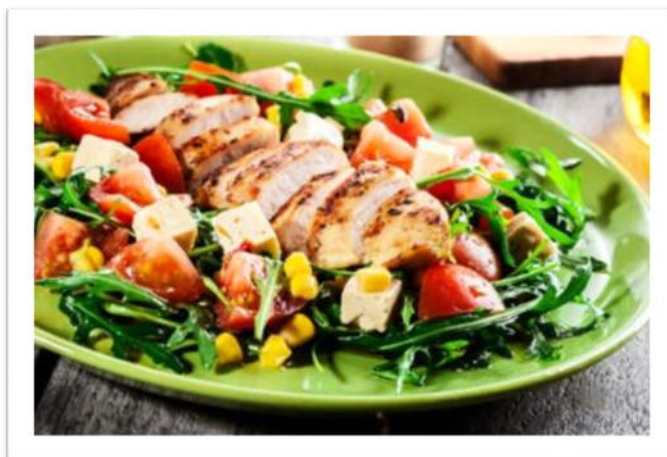
Ingredients:

- 4 thawed chicken breasts (bone in or boneless)
- 1 1/2 cups of your favorite hot sauce (bottled or home-made)
- 1 thinly sliced cucumber
- 2 Tablespoons Bleu cheese
- 1 cup fresh baby spinach—more if making salads
- Carrot and celery sticks
- Ranch dressing OR Bleu Cheese dressing
- If making sandwiches: 4 sandwich buns or hoagie rolls

Directions:

1. Place chicken in shallow, glass baking dish, pour hot sauce over the chicken, cover with plastic wrap and refrigerate overnight. The chicken is most flavorful if it is turned once about half way through.
2. Heat grill to medium temperature. Slowly grill the chicken until an internal temperature of 165 degrees is achieved. Allow chicken to rest under a tent of foil after removing from grill for 7 minutes.
3. To serve as a sandwich: Slice the chicken breasts, layer meat on the bun, top with bleu cheese, sliced cucumber, spinach and dressing to taste.
4. To serve as a salad: Dice the chicken, place on a bed of spinach, add bleu cheese and sliced cucumbers. Top with dressing as desired.
5. Enjoy with a side of carrot and celery sticks with Ranch or Bleu Cheese dressing.
