OBJECTIVES

- Encourage individuals to build and enhance relationships within their business and the community
- Balance personal and professional growth
- Develop dynamic leadership skills through education
- Inspire participants to take on leadership roles
- Increase understanding of Lincoln County issues, economics, and resources

DESCRIPTION

The Lincoln County Leadership
Institute will provide both educational
and participatory experiences. The
program consists of eight full day
sessions from October through May.
The curriculum is a blend of theory,
skills, and issues that include
participation in community based
experiences, board meetings, and
public hearings.

October 17, 2019 in Cokeville

Teambuilding Personalities

Sponsor: Town of Cokeville

Participants begin to explore skills that will establish constructive leadership styles, build positive relationships, and expand their understanding of working with various personalities.

November 21, 2019 in Kemmerer Leadership Styles

Stress Management/Drama Control Sponsor: Town of LaBarge

Class will expand upon the topics of leadership and improving skills to manage stress and control drama in the workplace.

December 19, 2019 in Afton Negotiation

Sponsor: Town of Afton

Participants will learn about the art of negotiation: Learn tools and strategies that can help when working with parties intending to reach understanding or resolve points of differences and achieve a win/win resolution.

January 16, 2019 in Kemmerer Getting Things done/Balancing work and time

Regulatory Compliance with life at work Sponsor: Town of Kemmerer & Afton Chambers of Commerce

Learn tools to become more effective with balancing work and time along with keeping the spark and finding the spark in dealing with regulatory compliance with life at work.

February 20, 2020 in Alpine Social Action Process; Out of the Box Thinking EQ- the softer side of leadership; Hope in a Community

Explore the principles of the softer side of leadership and from a followers' perspective examine the role "hope" plays in leadership and successful community development.

SELECTION

The Lincoln County Leadership Institute is open to emerging and established leaders who wish to increase their leadership skills, knowledge of Lincoln County, and participation in the community. Tuition is \$150 which includes instruction, materials, and meals. Participants must provide their own transportation. Attendance is required for the first session and is expected at all other sessions. Participants absent from more than one session will not graduate. Class size will be limited to 18 participants. Selection of participants will be based on criteria specified on the application form. Application deadline is September 25, 2019.


