### **Grow A Little Extra**

UW Extension is partnering with the Wyoming Hunger Initiative (WHI) for their Grow a Little Extra program. We would like to encourage 4-H clubs to use their *Hands to Larger Service* by growing and donating garden produce

to be distributed to local food pantries and anti-hunger agencies. The Cent\$ible Nutrition Program (CNP) is offering \$500 to the club that donates the most produce. The clubs that come in second and third place will receive \$300 and \$200, respectively. Clubs can create their own garden for donations, donate from personal gardens and/or community gardens, or collect donations from neighbors.

Produce donations can be delivered to your local county Extension Office. Donations will be received through September 30, 2023. The donations will be weighed and recorded, and then delivered to a local food pantry or neighbors in need. Make sure to specify the 4H club name when donating. Tracking will be sent to the state CNP office to tally the results. Awards will be given the first part of December.

Make sure your clubs know that to get credit for their donations, they will need to connect with their local county Extension Office to coordinate produce drop off, weighing, and recording.


### **Yearly Re-enrollment of Family Members**

Enrollment must be done <u>annually</u> to stay active in 4-H.

- Go to <a href="https://4h.zsuite.org/">https://4h.zsuite.org/</a> (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer). You will see a screen like this. (if not, press CTRL & F5).
- 2. Use the same email and password you used to sign up for zsuite.
- 3. Click LOGIN
  - if you forgot your password, click the **Forgot Password?** And you will be prompted to enter another password.
- 4. You MUST be signed in as the PRIMARY account to enroll members.
- 5. Once you log into your PRIMARY account, you will see a list of all the household members and their current enrollment status. Note the background color—Red signifies inactive profiles , while green signifies a member is currently enrolled. (NOTE: Each year, all profiles are made inactive.)
- 6. Click the picture besides the member you want to update. You can easily update inactive profiles by clicking
- 7. This will take you to the enrollment wizard form.

  Complete all information. (NOTE: Required fields will have an asterisk \* behind it. The system will not go to the next section until all required fields are completed.)
- 8. If you need to leave, prior to finishing your enrollment, click the 'SAVE FOR LATER' link at the bottom right of the form so you will not have to re-enter the data you've already completed.
- 9. Click at the bottom of the **Personal Information** section to go to the **Waivers** section. Click the Next button to go to the **Clubs** section





- 10. The 'CLUBS' section allows you to choose the clubs you'll be participating in for the year. You can choose more than one club, if desired, by selecting a club from the drop down menu and then clicking the orange **ADD CLUB** button. The clubs appear in their own box. NOTE: Do not click the "X" in the upper right hand of the club box unless you are not participating in that club.
- 11. You can add projects by clicking the green ADD PROJECT button and selecting it from the drop down menu.
- 12. You can delete projects by clicking the "x" next to the project you want deleted.
- 13. When done adding clubs and projects, click the ADD TO CART button.
- 14. If your county has an enrollment fee, you will handle this on the 'CHECKOUT' tab. Any payment methods chosen by your state will appear as options on the page. If your state does not have an enrollment fee, simply click the 'SUBMIT' button to submit your enrollment.
- 15. Once your enrollment is completed, your county administrators will be contacted regarding your enrollment. Your enrollment will be in a 'Pending Approval' state until approval from your county staff.
- 16. Once you're approved, your status will change to 'Active'.

Please log into your zSuite account weekly to check for announcements from your county and club leaders.







### **ZSuite Animal Information Upload Instructions**







- Once you are logged into ZSuite <u>primary</u> profile at: https://4h.zsuite.org, select the family member who has the project and click the UPDATE ENROLLMENT button.
- 2. Select CLUBS at the top right of the page.
- 3. To enter the animal information, select the gray pencil to the right of the Breeding/Market project listed in the club box. NOTE: If you have two animals, please put a comma between their information on each of the lines
- 4. Enter the 15 digit number in the **Animal Id** line.
- 5. Enter the animal's description on the **Animal Identifier** line.
- Enter the animal's name (IF you don't have a name, put N/
   A. Also for the Floater animal, put FLOATER in the name field.
- 7. On the **Animal Type** line enter whether they are market or breeding and then the gender.
- 8. Enter animal's breed on the Animal Breed line.
- Animal Picture 1—upload the picture of the tag in the animal's ear.
- Animal Picture 2—upload the picture of the full body of the animal.
- 11. **Animal Picture 3**—upload the second animal's ear tag picture (if there is only one animal, you can upload the same picture as you did in Animal 1).
- 12. **Animal Picture 4**—upload the second animal's full body picture (if there is only one animal, you can upload the same picture as you did in Animal 2). NOTE: All 4 picture areas must contain a picture.
- 13. Select the blue SAVE PROJECT button
- 14. Press the SUBMIT button at the bottom of the Clubs page to save it to your profile. Then click OK.

\*\*\*\* For Family Floater Animal—animals purchased as an extra in case someone in the family has one that dies—these can be transferred to another family member later ONLY if they are designated as a floater at the time of tagging. Please write the word FLOATER in the Animal Name field. The floater must be assigned to the family member whose name is on the bill of sale and/or Form A.

### STATE SHOOT DEADLINE: County Shoot Day

\* If you want to participate on a team at the State Shoot, you must qualify at the County Shoot.

### **County Shoot Range Rules**

- 1. Safety is a primary concern. Any violation of safe shooting will be grounds for participant disqualification. Shooter will follow the rules below:
  - a. Muzzle must be in a safe direction at all times
  - b. Action always open
  - c. Finger off trigger until ready to shoot
  - d. All firearms are considered loaded at all times.
- 2. Everyone in attendance will abide by the 3 R's Respect, Restraint, Responsibility
- 3. Only certified leaders on the firing line
- 4. Absolutely no one on berms/areas between ranges. Non-participating children must be attended by an adult AT ALL TIMES.
- 5. Parents and spectators must remain a safe distance from youth participants while competing.
- 6. Coaching youth who are on the firing line is not allowed.
- 7. Anyone can call a cease-fire at any time, for any unsafe condition.
- 8. Contestants are responsible for providing their own eye and hearing protection when required.
- 9. Shooters are responsible to provide their own ammunition/arrows for each discipline.
- 10. Each discipline has unique requirements and procedures. Parents and shooters are responsible for knowing the range rules and safety conditions for the discipline they participate in. Shooters will be familiar with the firearm they are using.
- 11. No food or drinks are allowed on the firing line.

### **Required Equipment/Procedures**

- Shotgun
  - ♦ Hearing and Eye protection is required
  - ♦ Shell pouch or vest
  - ♦ At the beginning of each relay, squad leaders will ask if the squad is ready, then call for a clay to begin.
  - ♦ Clays will cost \$4.00 per round of 25 and due with pre-registration. Clays used during practice are not included in this cost. Practice rounds will need to be paid for the day of county shoot. This cost is subject to change year to year based on current prices.
  - ♦ Firearms will be cased when brought to the firing line.
- Archery
  - ♦ Eye/Hearing protection is <u>not</u> required
  - ♦ Each contestant must have a quiver. Arm guards are recommended. All equipment is the responsibility of the shooter to provide.
  - ♦ Firearms will be cased when brought to the firing line.
- Muzzleloader
  - ♦ Eye and Hearing protection is required
  - ♦ Shooters will swab bore before reloading each shot
  - ♦ Powder measurer must be used no loading directly from powder horn or flask.
  - ♦ Firearms will be cased when brought to the firing line.
- .22 Rifle and Pistol
  - ♦ Hearing and Eye protection is required
  - ♦ Rifles must be loaded one shot at a time.
  - ♦ Firearms will be cased when brought to the firing line.
- Air Rifle and Pistol
  - ♦ Eye protection is required
  - ♦ Rifles and Pistols must be loaded one pellet at a time
  - ♦ Firearms will be cased when brought to the firing line.

### **Southwest Area Cook-off Contest Rules**

### **EXCEPT:**

- To register: log-in to your ZSuite Dashboard, Event Section and register each 4-H member who would like to participate. Pre-registration is required in order to ensure adequate space is available.
- Entry deadline is May 19, 2023.
- Jr./Int. Teams may pick one of the three recipes on the website after recipes are drawn on June 1. Dessert or salad plate size is recommended for presenting.
- Sr. Teams make an entree recipe using peaches (any form). Dessert or salad plate size is recommended for presenting.
- No microwave or oven allowed.
- All participant teams need to bring <u>all</u> their own food supplies and <u>all</u> cooking equipment.
- Supply lists are available on the state cook-off contest site listed above.

### **Southwest Area Cake Decorating Contest Rules**

Event Date: June 5, 2023, Afton Civic Center, Afton WY Entry Deadline: May 19, 2023

#### Eligibility/Rules:

- Open to all 4-H youth (excludes Cloverbuds). Age calculated as of January 1 of the current year.
- Entries are open to individuals or teams, but a youth must select one or the other.
- Teams may consist of up to three (3) youth and all must be in the same age category:
  - ♦ Junior Individuals 8-10 years old
  - ♦ Intermediate Individuals 11-13 years old
  - ♦ Senior Individuals 14-18 years old
  - ♦ Junior Teams 8-13 years old
  - ♦ Senior Teams 14-18 years old
- To register: log-in to your ZSuite Dashboard, Event Section and register each 4-H member who would like to participate. Preregistration is required in order to ensure adequate space is available.
- Entry deadline is May 19, 2023.
- Call your Extension Office if you have questions.

#### Materials:


- Contestants must bring their own cake (dummy form or cake) and have it base coated in white butter cream frosting. NO base frosting will be provided by the contest.
- All Teams & Senior Individuals must have rectangle cake forms base coated in white butter cream frosting.
- Junior & Intermediate Individuals must have round cake forms base coated in white butter cream frosting.
- ◆ Contestants must provide ALL their own equipment necessary to complete their creation i.e., tools, tips, bags, stamps, coloring, specialty icing, fondant, utensils, etc. This includes bowls for mixing, spoons, paper towel, and other cleaning supplies, aprons, gloves, everything else that may be needed.
- Running water will NOT be readily available in the room. Contestants will have limited access to a sink
  for clean up after the contest is over. However, contestants must make provisions for cleaning their
  own equipment. DO NOT clean anything in the bathrooms.

#### **Proceedings:**

- \* Each team/individual will use a table as workspace.
- \* Contestants have up to one (1) hour to complete their creation. During the first 5 minutes, coaches can help with the planning. After that allotted time the coaches may not have contact or help contestants. If coaches do not abide by this rule, they may be asked to leave the area and teams/individuals may be disqualified.
- \* This is a themed event. Youth will be informed of the topic/theme/subject for their creation upon the start of the event.
- \* Judges will be roaming during the event evaluating teamwork, technique, theme representation, food safety practices and cleanliness, organization, etc.
- \* Proper food safety practices will be encouraged and included in evaluations by judges.

### RESPONSIBILITY

### Responsibility

Responsibility is doing your best to take care of the things around you that need to be done.

Responsibility involves a few things:

- Accountability
- Using Self Control
- Having Goals
- Choosing a positive attitude
- Doing your duty
- Being proactive
- Setting a good example
- After looking at these things, do you think you are responsible?

How do we learn to be responsible? When we practice being responsible, we learn how to be more responsible. We also learn responsibility from good role models.

A big part of being responsible is making good choices. The two fundamental principles of good decisions are: 1—We all have the power to decide what we do and what we say.

2—We are all morally responsible for the consequences of our choices.

Remember, being responsible isn't always easy. If we work hard, and take responsibility for ourselves, it will be worth it in the end. Being responsible helps us achieve great things, and helps us feel good about ourselves and our accomplishments.

(The trick to the activity is to eliminate the letters "s-i-x-l-e-t-t-e-r-s" to reveal the hidden word of responsibility.)

After the youth have figured out the activity or you show them the trick, discuss the different aspects of responsibility. Possible discussion starters are:

What does responsibility mean to you?

How have you seen others act responsibly?

Do you think responsibility is important? Why?

How can we be responsible 4-H members?

Why be responsible?

### **Dandelion: Completely Edible!**

Although pesky in your lawn, dandelions can actually be a really tasty treat when it comes to eating! Dandelions have been known to have a similar flavor profile as honey, making them a great addition to recipes. Dandelions are completely edible, that's right, the flowers, leaves, and roots can all be eaten! With that in mind, you may look at a field of dandelions differently!

#### Harvesting

When making dishes with dandelions be sure to harvest unsprayed dandelions and check with local regulations before foraging for dandelions somewhere other than your own property. Although I'd say yes to anyone wanting to pick dandelions out of my lawn, always check with the owner before doing so. So, you've harvested your dandelions, what are you going to do with them now? Be sure to wash your dandelions before using them to prevent unwanted insects and other contaminants. After they are all washed up there are many ways to use dandelions!

#### **Enjoy Many Ways**

There are countless ways to use dandelions such as in a salad using the dandelion greens, or maybe just as a topping to salads, pizza, casseroles, and more! Dandelion tea is also a favorite of those that enjoy tea. You can also make sauces with dandelion greens, such as pesto, syrups, and freezer jelly! The Fresh Dandelion Jelly recipe below is a great spread and can be used like honey, spread over toast, peanut butter sandwiches, and more!

### Fresh Dandelion Jelly

Recipe Source: Food & Nutrition

Yield: 5 cups

#### Ingredients:

- 3 cups packed fresh dandelion blossoms
- 4 cups water
- 4 ½ cups sugar
- 1 box powdered pectin
- 2 tablespoons bottled lemon juice
- 1 drop yellow food coloring (optional)

#### Instructions:

- Using your thumbnail, cut and pluck the yellow blossom away from the tiny green leaves holding it (your thumb will get sticky, and the flower will separate into petals.) Remove as much of the green as possible because this part is bitter and turns the jelly green.
- 2. In a medium saucepan, bring water to a boil. Add half the blossoms, stir and cover. Turn off the heat and steep for 20 minutes. Using a fine-mesh strainer, strain and gently push on blossoms to remove some of the water. Add the same dandelion water back to the saucepan and bring to a boil. Add remaining blossoms and cover. Steep for 15 minutes, then repeat the straining process.
- 3. Bring 3 cups steeping liquid to a boil along with sugar, pectin, lemon juice, and (optional) food coloring, stirring until sugar dissolves. Boil for 1 minute, then skim off foam with a wooden or plastic spoon.
- 4. Pour into freezer containers leaving ½-inch space at the top and store in the refrigerator, or freezer for longer storage.
