4-H Educator's Letter...

April 21 – 27 is National Volunteer Week. As this week approaches, we want to give a huge "thank you" to all the volunteers who help make 4-H in Lincoln County possible. Our program works because of your help. Be sure to thank your 4-H leaders and fellow volunteers during this week.

Spring is approaching, which means 4-H members will be picking up their animals soon. Remember to follow USDA laws when transporting animals and ask at the Afton or Kemmerer Offices if you need a flyer for your reference. Those of you picking up animals out of state, remember you'll have to stop at the Port of Entry on your way into Wyoming and will need a recent health inspection form (within 30 days). Swine, make sure your Interstate Certified Vet Inspection (ICVI) has a permit number on it! Swine should also have an ID tag, which should be noted on your ICVI. Questions, check out more information on ear tags here: http://www.aphis.usda.gov/traceability/downloads/ADT eartags criteria.pdf

Don't forget to collect your paperwork along with your animals! For all market goats and swine projects, make sure that you have a bill of sale *in the 4-H member's name*. For sheep and goats, make sure they have a USDA Scrapie's tag in their ear. Finally, for sheep, you will need a "Form A" brand inspection form *in the 4-H member's name*. This has to be completed by a brand inspector.

With that, best of luck with your projects this year. Work hard, learn lots, and most importantly, have fun!

2024 Fair Changes (so far)

Date—August 3-10, 2024

<u>Theme</u> — "See the Best of the Best" at the Lincoln County Fair

Fair Entry Deadline—July 1—July 31, 2024

<u>Premiums</u>—will <u>only be available</u> <u>Wednesday-Saturday</u> (11 am to 6 pm) of fair at the payout window by the fair board office.

4-H Horse Certification Testing Deadline—must be done **before July 20** of the fair year.

<u>Rules/Regulations</u> – All Exhibitors are cautioned to carefully READ the rules and regulations as well as each division rules, they will be strictly enforced!

Improper Conduct—An exhibitor and/or parents may be asked to leave the fairgrounds for improper conduct.

<u>Certified Vet Inspection Required</u>—No animal will be allowed to exhibit or compete without a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, or meeting species requirements as outlined. The professional judgment of the veterinarian will be the final deciding factor on all animals.

<u>Fitting</u>—There will be absolutely no altering market animals' natural physical build by means such as tubing, drenching, airing, injections, or insertion of foreign material under the skin. If an animal is deemed in need of medical intervention by tubing, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the livestock committee and arrange for their personal veterinarian to come to the fairgrounds, observe the animal, prescribe treatment, and treat the animal. There will be not tubing or drenching allowed for cosmetic purposes. All concerns for animals health must be brought before a member of the Livestock Committee before action is taken.

<u>Barn Safety</u>—ALL BARN AISLES MUST BE KEPT CLEAR, no blocking of the aisles is allowed. Grooming, cleaning, storing of equipment, etc. that blocks the passage will not be allowed. This is a safety issue and will not be tolerated.

Auction Resale—There will be no resale allowed for any market animals, the sale animal has become the property of the buyer upon the final bid being made. If the owner wishes to sell their newly acquired animal, it is up to the new owner to facilitate that sale. It will no longer be allowed to resell during the livestock auction.

<u>Livestock Equipment</u>—Must bring own hoses, they will not be provided.



State Shoot—The 2024 Wyoming 4-H State Shoot is tentatively scheduled to be held July 11-14 2024 in Douglas, Wyoming.






Enrolling in Wyoming 4-H

- Go to https://4h.zsuite.org/ (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer)
- 2. Click Sign Up
- Fill in the required fields (you can use your same email and password from 4HOnline).






- Create a pin number (we recommend an easy to remember four-digit number, like the last four numbers of your phone number).
 - REMEMBER your password and pin number, you will need it to access your enrollment!
- Select Wyoming and your home County.
- 3. Click Let's Go




You should now be directed to the Dashboard screen.

- To add members, in the black drop down menu, select household members.
- 2. On the next screen, select
- Fill in the required fields for one of your members.

You will return to the **Household Members** screen. The member you added should appear in the list along with yourself. Repeat this process for the other members of your household.








ZSuite 4-H Enrollment







Returning Member Enrollment

Yearly Re-enrollment of Family Members

Enrollment must be done annually to stay active in 4-H.

- Go to https://4h.zsuite.org/ (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer). You will see a screen like this.
- 2. Use the same email and password you used to sign up for zsuite.
- 3. Click LOGIN
 - if you forgot your password, click the **Forgot Pass-word?** And you will be prompted to enter another password.
- 4. You MUST be signed in as the PRIMARY account to enroll members.
- 5. Once you log into your PRIMARY account, you will see a list of all the household members and their current enrollment status. - Note the background color—Red signifies inactive profiles , while green signifies a member is currently enrolled. (NOTE: Each year, all profiles are made inactive.)
- 6. Click the picture besides the member you want to update. You can easily update inactive profiles by clicking
- 7. This will take you to the enrollment wizard form.
 Complete all information. (NOTE: Required fields will have an asterisk * behind it. The system will not go to the next section until all required fields are completed.)
- 8. If you need to leave, prior to finishing your enrollment, click the 'SAVE FOR LATER' link at the bottom right of the form so you will not have to re-enter the data you've already completed.
- 9. Click at the bottom of the **Personal Information** section to go to the **Waivers** section. Click the Next button to go to the **Clubs** section





- 10. The 'CLUBS' section allows you to choose the clubs you'll be participating in for the year. You can choose more than one club, if desired, by selecting a club from the drop down menu and then clicking the orange **ADD CLUB** button. The clubs appear in their own box. NOTE: Do not click the "X" in the upper right hand of the club box unless you are not participating in that club.
- 11. You can add projects by clicking the green ADD PROJECT button and selecting it from the drop down menu.
- 12. You can delete projects by clicking the "x" next to the project you want deleted.
- 13. If your county has an enrollment fee, you will handle this on the 'CHECKOUT' tab. Any payment methods chosen by your state will appear as options on the page. If your state does not have an enrollment fee, simply click the 'SUBMIT' button to submit your enrollment.
- 14. Once your enrollment is completed, your county administrators will be contacted regarding your enrollment. Your enrollment will be in a 'Pending Approval' state until approval from your county staff.
- 15. Once you're approved, your status will change to 'Active'.







ZSuite Animal Information Upload Instructions








- Once you are logged into ZSuite <u>primary</u> profile at: https://4h.zsuite.org, select the family member who has the project and click the UPDATE ENROLLMENT button.
- 2. Select **CLUBS** at the top right of the page.
- 3. To enter the animal information, select the gray pencil to the right of the Breeding/Market project listed in the club box. NOTE: If you have two animals, please put a comma between their information on each of the lines
- 4. Enter the 15 digit number in the **Animal Id** line.
- 5. Enter the animal's description on the **Animal Identifier** line.
- Enter the animal's name (IF you don't have a name, put N/
 A. Also for the Floater animal, put FLOATER in the name field.
- 7. On the **Animal Type** line enter whether they are market or breeding and then the gender.
- 8. Enter animal's breed on the Animal Breed line.
- 9. **Animal Picture 1**—upload the picture of the tag in the animal's ear.
- 10. **Animal Picture 2**—upload the picture of the full body of the animal.
- 11. **Animal Picture 3**—upload the second animal's ear tag picture (if there is only one animal, you can upload the same picture as you did in Animal 1).
- 12. **Animal Picture 4**—upload the second animal's full body picture (if there is only one animal, you can upload the same picture as you did in Animal 2). NOTE: All 4 picture areas must contain a picture.
- 13. Select the blue SAVE PROJECT button
- 14. Press the SUBMIT button at the bottom of the Clubs page to save it to your profile. These click OK.

**** For Family Floater Animal—animals purchased as an extra in case someone in the family has one that dies—these can be transferred to another family member later ONLY if they are designated as a floater at the time of tagging. Please write the word FLOATER in the Animal Name field. The floater must be assigned to the family member whose name is on the bill of sale and/or Form A.

What is Respect?

Respect is very important in our relationships with others. When we respect others, we treat them with consideration and courtesy both verbally and physically. Check for Respect 4-H

The laughs gained with playing this game with your club can add some fun and give your club members the judgment to understand that the humor can be funny to listen to, but not funny if it is acted out. Some examples include:

- You feel a sneeze coming, so you
- a) look for someone to sneeze on
- b) cover your mouth and nose with your hands
- c) turn your head away from

people and let the sneeze out as loudly as possible.

- Company is over. And you notice that after the meal, your mom has a big piece of lettuce on her tooth. You
- a) point at it and start laughing as loud as you can,
- b) ask if anyone can tell which of your mom's teeth is not like the other
- c) quietly whisper in your mom's ear that she

should check her teeth in the bathroom.

Once your 4-Her's understand the idea behind making up scenarios for the game, they will want to make up some of their own, too.

Now, when club members treat each other or possessions with respect, remember to say,

"Check for respect."

Mixed Fruit Parfait

Customize this fast breakfast or snack option with your favorite fruit and yogurt.

Ingredients

- 1 cup fresh, frozen, or dried fruit of choice (cherries, apples, blueberries, strawberries, peaches, pears, pineapple, etc.)
- 2 cups low-fat yogurt, vanilla, plain, or your favorite flavor
- 1/2 cup granola or crushed cereal (optional)

Directions

- Wash hands with warm, soapy water for 20 seconds.
- If fruit is frozen, allow it to thaw. Cut large pieces of fruit into bite-sized pieces.
- Layer a small amount of yogurt and fruit in three glasses.
- Repeat layers until glass is full.
- 5. Top with granola or crushed cereal (optional).
- Serve and eniov.

(Available seeds are: Plum Regal Tomatoes, Lunchbox Peppers, Honey Bear Acorn Squash, Gateway Cucumbers, Sun Angel Spinach, and Provider Green Beans). These seeds can be picked up at the Extension Office in Afton and Teton County Extension (near Miller Park) today!

In conjunction with this, we are also looking for talented individuals that are comfortable sharing their gardening expertise with individuals and organizations that also want to participate in Grow A Little Extra.
