4-H Educator's Letter...


April 21-27 is National Volunteer week. We would like to Thank all of our volunteers for all their hard work and dedication to the youth of Lincoln County! Our program is what is, and keeps growing, because of our amazing volunteers. Thank you!

It is that time of year when our 4-H clubs are in full swing. It is the time when many of you are thinking about getting your lambs, goats and swine projects. Remember to make sure you are in compliance with the state laws when you are transporting animals! Remember that the Form A (Brand Inspection) needs to be in the 4-H members name.

Animals coming into Wyoming need to have an official USDA ear tag in their ear. They should be put in the ear by the producer. Additionally, the vet that inspects the animals before they are shipped to Wyoming should be calling the Wyoming State Vet's office to get an import permit number that is placed on the health papers (CVI). 2024 Fair Changes (so far)

Date—August 3-10, 2024

<u>Theme</u> — "See the Best of the Best" at the Lincoln County Fair

Fair Entry Deadline—July 1—July 31, 2024

<u>Premiums</u>—will <u>only be available</u> Wednesday-Saturday (11 am to 6 pm) of fair at the payout window by the fair board office.

4-H Horse Certification Testing Deadline—must be done before July 20 of the fair year.

<u>Rules/Regulations</u> – All Exhibitors are cautioned to carefully READ the rules and regulations as well as each division rules, they will be strictly enforced!

<u>Improper Conduct</u>—An exhibitor and/or parents may be asked to leave the fairgrounds for improper conduct.

<u>Certified Vet Inspection Required</u>—No animal will be allowed to exhibit or compete without a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, or meeting species requirements as outlined. The professional judgment of the veterinarian will be the final deciding factor on all animals.

Fitting—There will be absolutely no altering market animals' natural physical build by means such as tubing, drenching, airing, injections, or insertion of foreign material under the skin. If an animal is deemed in need of medical intervention by tubing, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the livestock committee and arrange for their personal veterinarian to come to the fairgrounds, observe the animal, prescribe treatment, and treat the animal. There will be not tubing or drenching allowed for cosmetic purposes. All concerns for animals health must be brought before a member of the Livestock Committee before action is taken.

Barn Safety—ALL BARN AISLES MUST BE KEPT CLEAR, no blocking of the aisles is allowed. Grooming, cleaning, storing of equipment, etc. that blocks the passage will not be allowed. This is a safety issue and will not be tolerated.

Auction Resale—There will be no resale allowed for any market animals, the sale animal has become the property of the buyer upon the final bid being made. If the owner wishes to sell their newly acquired animal, it is up to the new owner to facilitate that sale. It will no longer be allowed to resell during the livestock auction.

<u>Livestock Equipment</u>—Must bring own hoses, they will not be provided.







- Go to https://4h.zsuite.org/ (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer)
- 2. Click Sign Up
- Fill in the required fields (you can use your same email and password from 4HOnline).






- Create a pin number (we recommend an easy to remember four-digit number, like the last four numbers of your phone number).

- 3. Click Let's Go




You should now be directed to the Dashboard screen.

You will return to the **Household Members** screen. The member you added should appear in the list along with yourself. Repeat this process for the other members of your household.








ZSuite 4-H Enrollment





Returning Member Enrollment

Yearly Re-enrollment of Family Members

Enrollment must be done annually to stay active in 4-H.

- Go to https://4h.zsuite.org/ (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer). You will see a screen like this.
- 2. Use the same email and password you used to sign up for zsuite.
- 3. Click LOGIN
 - if you forgot your password, click the **Forgot Pass-word?** And you will be prompted to enter another password.
- 4. You MUST be signed in as the PRIMARY account to enroll members.
- 5. Once you log into your PRIMARY account, you will see a list of all the household members and their current enrollment status. - Note the background color—Red signifies inactive profiles , while green signifies a member is currently enrolled. (NOTE: Each year, all profiles are made inactive.)
- 6. Click the picture besides the member you want to update. You can easily update inactive profiles by clicking
- 7. This will take you to the enrollment wizard form.
 Complete all information. (NOTE: Required fields will have an asterisk * behind it. The system will not go to the next section until all required fields are completed.)
- 8. If you need to leave, prior to finishing your enrollment, click the 'SAVE FOR LATER' link at the bottom right of the form so you will not have to re-enter the data you've already completed.
- 9. Click at the bottom of the **Personal Information** section to go to the **Waivers** section. Click the Next button to go to the **Clubs** section





- 10. The 'CLUBS' section allows you to choose the clubs you'll be participating in for the year. You can choose more than one club, if desired, by selecting a club from the drop down menu and then clicking the orange **ADD CLUB** button. The clubs appear in their own box. NOTE: Do not click the "X" in the upper right hand of the club box unless you are not participating in that club.
- 11. You can add projects by clicking the green ADD PROJECT button and selecting it from the drop down menu.
- 12. You can delete projects by clicking the "x" next to the project you want deleted.
- 13. If your county has an enrollment fee, you will handle this on the 'CHECKOUT' tab. Any payment methods chosen by your state will appear as options on the page. If your state does not have an enrollment fee, simply click the 'SUBMIT' button to submit your enrollment.
- 14. Once your enrollment is completed, your county administrators will be contacted regarding your enrollment. Your enrollment will be in a 'Pending Approval' state until approval from your county staff.
- 15. Once you're approved, your status will change to 'Active'.








- Once you are logged into ZSuite <u>primary</u> profile at: https://4h.zsuite.org, select the family member who has the project and click the <u>UPDATE ENROLLMENT</u> button.
- 2. Select **CLUBS** at the top right of the page.
- 3. To enter the animal information, select the gray pencil to the right of the Breeding/Market project listed in the club box. NOTE: If you have two animals, please put a comma between their information on each of the lines
- 4. Enter the 15 digit number in the **Animal Id** line.
- 5. Enter the animal's description on the **Animal Identifier** line.
- Enter the animal's name (IF you don't have a name, put N/
 A. Also for the Floater animal, put FLOATER in the name field.
- 7. On the **Animal Type** line enter whether they are market or breeding and then the gender.
- 8. Enter animal's breed on the Animal Breed line.
- 9. **Animal Picture 1**—upload the picture of the tag in the animal's ear.
- 10. **Animal Picture 2**—upload the picture of the full body of the animal.
- 11. **Animal Picture 3**—upload the second animal's ear tag picture (if there is only one animal, you can upload the same picture as you did in Animal 1).
- 12. **Animal Picture 4**—upload the second animal's full body picture (if there is only one animal, you can upload the same picture as you did in Animal 2). NOTE: All 4 picture areas must contain a picture.
- 13. Select the blue SAVE PROJECT button
- 14. Press the SUBMIT button at the bottom of the Clubs page to save it to your profile. These click OK.

**** For Family Floater Animal—animals purchased as an extra in case someone in the family has one that dies—these can be transferred to another family member later ONLY if they are designated as a floater at the time of tagging. Please write the word FLOATER in the Animal Name field. The floater must be assigned to the family member whose name is on the bill of sale and/or Form A.

Zesty Lemon Pepper Fish Packets

Makes 4 servings

Ingredients

- 1 pound fish fillets (tilapia, catfish, cod, etc.)
- 2 small yellow squash or zucchinis, roughly chopped
- 2 bell peppers, cut into strips
- 1/2 cup onion, sliced
- 2 lemons, cut into thin rounds
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- Aluminum foil

Directions

- 1. Wash hands with warm, soapy water for 20 seconds.
- Divide fish fillets into 4 portions and place on 4 sheets of aluminum foil (12x 18 inches each). Sprinkle with salt and pepper.
- Lay lemon rounds over fillets. Evenly divide chopped vegetables between packets, placing on top of fillets.
- Wrap each packet by bringing up the sides. Double fold the top and ends to seal. Leave room for heat to circulate.
- 5. Cook the packets using one of the following methods:
 - Oven—place packets on a baking sheet. Bake at 450°F for 30 minutes. Halfway through baking, use a fork to poke small holes in the packet for steam to escape.
 - **Electric Skillet** heat skillet to 400°F. Use a cooking rack in the bottom of the skillet. Pour 1/2 inch water into the skillet. Place the backets on the rack. Cover and close the steam vent. If you do not have a rack make your own with aluminum foil. Form foil into a long snake about 1 inch thick. Form into a coil to fit in the skillet. Place the packet son top of the coil.
 - <u>Grill</u>—heat grill to medium-high or 400-450°F. Place packets on grates and cook for 2-30 minutes.
- Packets are done when the fish reaches 145°F on the food thermometer. When cooking is done, carefully open packets to allow steam to escape.

In conjunction with this, we are also looking for talented individuals that are comfortable sharing their gardening expertise with individuals and organizations that also want to participate in Grow A Little Extra.

Grow A Little Extra is a partnership with the First Lady Jennie Gordon's Wyoming Hunger Initiative, the University of Wyoming Extension's Cent\$ible Nutrition Program (CNP) and Master Gardener Program, encouraging community organizations and individuals to grow extra produce for neighbors facing food insecurity.
