2024 Fair Changes (so far)

Date—August 3-10, 2024

<u>Theme</u> — "See the Best of the Best" at the Lincoln County Fair

Fair Entry Deadline—July 1—July 31, 2024

<u>Premiums</u>—will <u>only be available</u> Wednesday-Saturday (11 am to 6 pm) of fair at the payout window by the fair board office.

<u>4-H Horse Certification Testing Deadline</u>—must be done **be**fore July 20 of the fair year.

<u>Rules/Regulations</u> – All Exhibitors are cautioned to carefully READ the rules and regulations as well as each division rules, they will be strictly enforced!

Improper Conduct—An exhibitor and/or parents may be asked to leave the fairgrounds for improper conduct.

<u>Certified Vet Inspection Required</u>—No animal will be allowed to exhibit or compete without a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection, or meeting species requirements as outlined. The professional judgment of the veterinarian will be the final deciding factor on all animals.

Fitting—There will be absolutely no altering market animals' natural physical build by means such as tubing, drenching, airing, injections, or insertion of foreign material under the skin. If an animal is deemed in need of medical intervention by tubing, it is the responsibility of the exhibitor to notify the livestock committee and arrange for their personal veterinarian to come to the fairgrounds, observe the animal, prescribe treatment, and treat the animal. There will be not tubing or drenching allowed for cosmetic purposes. All concerns for animals health must be brought before a member of the Livestock Committee before action is taken.

Barn Safety—ALL BARN AISLES MUST BE KEPT CLEAR, no blocking of the aisles is allowed. Grooming, cleaning, storing of equipment, etc. that blocks the passage will not be allowed. This is a safety issue and will not be tolerated.

<u>Auction Resale</u>—There will be no resale allowed for any market animals, the sale animal has become the property of the buyer upon the final bid being made. If the owner wishes to sell their newly acquired animal, it is up to the new owner to facilitate that sale. It will no longer be allowed to resell during the livestock auction.

<u>Livestock Equipment</u>—Must bring own hoses, they will not be provided.



Southwest Area Cook-off Contest Rules

The area will follow the state rules located on the state 4-H website –

EXCEPT:

- To register: log-in to your ZSuite Dashboard, Event Section and register each 4-H member who would like to participate. Pre-registration is required in order to ensure adequate space is available.
- Entry deadline is June 6, 2024.
- Jr./Int. Teams (2-4 members) Choose a Disney Theme recipe. Dessert or salad plate size is recommended for presenting.
- Sr. Teams (2-4 members) Create a Disney Theme entrée using: Substitutions. Dessert or salad plate size is recommended for presenting.
- (1) Electric skillet and/or (1) single and/or double hot plate and or Rice/Vegetable cooker. Only 2 heating items allowed. No microwave or oven allowed.
- Each team should dress appropriately for the preparation of food (no full or draping sleeves; closed-toe shoes only; hair appropriately restrained, etc.) Each team can coordinate clothing, aprons, etc.
- All participant teams need to bring <u>all</u> their own food supplies and <u>all</u> the needed cooking equipment (do not add anything not listed on the state supply list). You must bring extension cords!
- Substitution supply lists are available on the state cook-off contest site listed above.

NOTE: Running water will NOT be readily available in the room. Contestants must make provisions for cleaning their own equipment. **DO NOT** clean anything in the bathrooms.



Southwest Area Cake Decorating Contest Rules Event Date: June 13, 2024, Afton Civic Center, Afton WY Entry Deadline: June 6, 2024

Eligibility/Rules:

- Open to all 4-H youth (excludes Cloverbuds). Age calculated as of January 1 of the current year.
- Entries are open to individuals.
 - ♦ Junior Individuals 8-10 years old
 - ◊ Intermediate Individuals 11-13 years old
 - \diamond Senior Individuals 14-18 years old
- To register: log-in to your ZSuite Dashboard, Event Section and register each 4-H member who would like to participate. Pre -registration is required in order to ensure adequate space is available.
- Entry deadline is June 6, 2024.
- Call your Extension Office if you have questions.

Materials:

Contestants must bring their own cake (dummy form or cake) and have it base coated in white butter cream frosting. NO base frosting will be provided by the contest.

<u>Senior Individuals</u> – must have rectangle cake forms base coated in white butter cream frosting. <u>Junior & Intermediate Individuals</u> – must have round cake forms base coated in white butter cream frosting.


- Contestants must provide ALL their own equipment necessary to complete their creation i.e., tools, tips, bags, stamps, coloring, specialty icing, fondant, utensils, etc. This includes bowls for mixing, spoons, paper towels, and other cleaning supplies, aprons, gloves, everything else that may be needed.
- Running water will NOT be readily available in the room. Contestants will have limited access to a sink for clean up after the contest is over. However, contestants must make provisions for cleaning their own equipment. DO NOT clean anything in the bathrooms.

Proceedings:

- \Rightarrow Each individual will use a table as workspace.
- ⇒ Contestants have up to one (1) hour to complete their creation. During the first 5 minutes, coaches can help with the planning. After that allotted time the coaches may not have contact or help contestants. If coaches do not abide by this rule, they may be asked to leave the area and individuals may be disqualified.
- \Rightarrow This is a themed event. Youth will be informed of the topic/theme/subject for their creation upon the start of the event.
- ⇒ Judges will be roaming during the event evaluating teamwork, technique, theme representation, food safety practices and cleanliness, organization, etc.
- \Rightarrow Proper food safety practices will be encouraged and included in evaluations by judges.

Enrollment must be done **<u>annually</u>** to stay active in 4-H.

- Go to <u>https://4h.zsuite.org/</u> (open in Google Chrome, not Internet Explorer). You will see a screen like this.
- 2. Use the same email and password you used to sign up for zsuite.
- 3. Click LOGIN

- if you forgot your password, click the **Forgot Password?** And you will be prompted to enter another password.

- 4. You MUST be signed in as the PRIMARY account to enroll members.
- Once you log into your PRIMARY account, you will see a list of all the household members and their current enrollment status. - Note the background color—Red signifies inactive profiles , while green signifies a member is currently enrolled. (NOTE: Each year, all profiles are made inactive.)
- 6. Click the picture besides the member you want to update. You can easily update inactive profiles by clicking
- 7. This will take you to the enrollment wizard form.
 Complete all information. (NOTE: Required fields will
 have an asterisk * behind it. The system will not go to the next section until all required fields are completed.)
- 8. If you need to leave, prior to finishing your enrollment, click the 'SAVE FOR LATER' link at the bottom right of the form so you will not have to re-enter the data you've already completed.
- 9. Click at the bottom of the **Personal Information** section to go to the **Waivers** section. Click the Next button to go to the **Clubs** section

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
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- 10. The 'CLUBS' section allows you to choose the clubs you'll be participating in for the year. You can choose more than one club, if desired, by selecting a club from the drop down menu and then clicking the orange **ADD CLUB** button. The clubs appear in their own box. NOTE: Do not click the "X" in the upper right hand of the club box unless you are not participating in that club.
- You can add projects by clicking the green ADD
 PROJECT button and selecting it from the drop down menu.
- 12. You can delete projects by clicking the "x" next to the project you want deleted.
- 13. If your county has an enrollment fee, you will handle this on the 'CHECKOUT' tab. Any payment methods chosen by your state will appear as options on the page. If your state does not have an enrollment fee, simply click the 'SUBMIT' button to submit your enrollment.
- 14. Once your enrollment is completed, your county administrators will be contacted regarding your enrollment. Your enrollment will be in a 'Pending Approval' state until approval from your county staff.
- 15. Once you're approved, your status will change to 'Active'.

Please log into your zSuite account weekly to check for announcements from your county and club leaders.

ZSuite Animal Information Upload Instructions



- Once you are logged into ZSuite <u>primary</u> profile at: https://4h.zsuite.org, select the family member who has the project and click the UPDATE ENROLLMENT button.
- 2. Select CLUBS at the top right of the page.
- To enter the animal information, select the gray pencil to the right of the Beef/Market project listed in the club box.
 NOTE: If you have two animals, put the second animal's information under animal #2 section.
- 4. Enter the 15 digit number in the **Animal Id** line.
- 5. Enter the animal's <u>description</u> on the **Animal Identifier** line.
- Enter the animal's name (IF you don't have a name, put N/ A. Also for the Floater animal, put FLOATER in the name field.
- 7. On the **Animal Type** line enter whether they are market or breeding and then the gender.
- 8. Enter animal's breed on the Animal Breed line.
- 9. **How Many Pictures**—select the number of pictures from the drop down menu.
- 10. Animal Picture 1—upload the picture of the tag in the animal's ear.
- 11. **Animal Picture 2**—upload the picture of the full body of the animal.
- 12. Animal #2 Info—If you have a second animal, please follow instructions #4 through #11 to add the info for the second animal. If you don't have a second animal, skip to #13 & 14.
- 13. Select the blue SAVE PROJECT button

14.Click the SUBMIT button at the bottom of the club page to save the updated information.

**** For Family Floater Animal — animals purchased as an extra in case someone in the family has one that dies these can be transferred to another family member later ONLY if they are designated as a floater at the time of tagging. Please write the word FLOATER in the Animal Name field. The floater must be assigned to the family member whose name is on the bill of sale and/or Form A.

Responsibility involves a few things:


- Accountability

Chicken Fried Rice

A great way to use leftover rice and works great with canned, frozen, or fresh chicken.

Ingredients

- 3-4 green onions, sliced
- 2 Tablespoons canola oil
- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1 1/2 cups pre-cooked chicken or 110-ounce can or pouch of chicken
- 3 cups cooked brown rice
- 2 Tablespoons low-sodium soy sauce

Directions

- 1. Wash hands with warm, soapy water for 20 seconds.
- 2. If rice is not cooked, follow directions ion package and cook it first.
- In a skillet or electric skillet, cook green onions in oil until tender. Add egg and cook to a scrambled egg consistency. Remove eggs from pan.
- 4. Increase heat to high. Add rice, chicken, and soy sauce. Stir constantly until rice is heated through.

Variation

• Add Veggies—In step 4, add 1 1/2 cups of canned vegetables or a 10-ounce bag of frozen vegetables.
