Check in & vet check 9:00-9:45 a.m.

At CWF Arena, by the 4-H Office, \$2.50/person

Wednesday, July 24th

4:00-6:00 p.m. **Horse** at CWF Outdoor Arena, \$3.00/animal

**ALL horses MUST be checked at this Vet Inspection.

(note: Do not ride horses before the inspection.)

**Open riding will be available at the CWF outdoor arena from 6:00 p.m. until dark

Vet Check Information Guidelines:

- * Veterinarians will be checking for the good health of your animal, to include but not limited to: any and all infectious, contagious or communicable diseases and that they are free of any obvious things such as runny noses, open lesions or abscesses, scours, etc.
- * They will be looking for lice and mites. If warranted, a temperature may be taken.
- * All animals, ear tags and trailers must be clean (sawdust is suggested in trailers hauling swine). Ear tags should be clean and legible.
- * Blankets will be removed from all lambs and horses for inspection.
- * All beef, goats and lambs will be removed from trailers for inspection.
- * Scrapies tags are required for every lamb coming through vet check, no tags will be issued that day.
- * Every goat will have a legible tattoo or scrapies tag in place. Copies of paperwork for registered goats is required. Dr. Smylie will have a microchip scanner for those who need those services.

Entering the Central Wyoming Fairgrounds

Once you receive your certificate of health and/or are inspected, go to the Fairgrounds and enter through either ARLC gate or the 13th Street Gate (northeast corner), and check in with your respective Barn Superintendent before unloading animals.

Barn Rules

Tack for beef, sheep & goats, any decorations may be moved in prior to animal arrival with approval of Barn Superintendents who will have your pen assignments and will be on the grounds Saturday, July 6th from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. in the Arena. You MUST be out by 2:00 p.m.

The Arena will open at 7:30 a.m. and locked at 9:00 p.m., Sunday July 7th (7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., slider door only). Swine members may move equipment in Saturday, July 6th from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

The Arena will be locked at 9:00 p.m. Sunday, July 7th and at 10:00 p.m. Fair week for all exhibitors. The doors are locked to the public at 9:00 p.m.

Dear 4-H & FFA Exhibitors:

Listed in this brochure is the information on the certificates of health (CVI) for this year's Fair.

You must use the veterinarians our committees have made arrangements with for your health certificates.

The health of your animals is important to you and to us. Whether your family has one or hundreds of animals, you have an investment in your animals and need assurance that they are not being exposed to diseases. If you are uncertain of your animal's health, don't wait until our Fair check-in time to correct a potential problem because we will not allow sick animals on the grounds.

NOTE: An "Animal Care Committee" has been established to oversee State Statute, Title 11, Chapter 1. See Wyoming State Fair book for information or the Central Wyoming Fairbook. **One dollar of each vet check fee will be deposited in an "Animal Care Committee" fund to cover expected costs.**

ALL animals being shown at Central Wyoming Fair MUST go through the inspection check point at the ARLC and then take their CVI paperwork to the appropriate species Barn Superintendents before unloading.

- ◆ You may then bring your paperwork to the 4-H/FFA Fair Office in the Arena for processing, you will then receive your family's car pass.
- ◆ If you have sheep or beef, we'll also need your titles for the brand inspector, before passes are issued.
- ◆ ***If your livestock trailer is not clean (including clean bedding), when you arrive for your health checks before Fair, your animals will not be inspected until you return with a clean trailer. We all need to have respect for our veterinarian who has taken the time out of his busy practice to help us with this process.***

VET CHECKS Sunday, July 7th

Vet Checks will be available during specified times only.
NO EXCEPTIONS

All animals must pass through the ARLC lot unless otherwise specified. Sheep & goats will be unloaded. Ear tags must be clean and legible.

**All Large Livestock to Include:

Must be vet checked and in the barn by 9:00 a.m.

ARLC Parking Lot Directions

The ARLC is located at 2011 Fairgrounds Road. Enter through the south end of the parking lot and line up. Someone will be there to provide you with the paperwork you will need to fill out.

PLEASE NOTE: If you would like to complete your Vet check forms ahead of time, they will be available for you to pick up at the 4-H Office beginning June 28th.

Vet check fees will be collected in the Oregon Trail Room.
