


NATRONA COUNTY 4-H "ALIGN YOUR FOCUS" EDITION

Dear 4-H Families & Friends:

Let's talk about your comfort zone...it's called a comfort zone for a reason, right? It's comfortable place to be. It takes energy to move something into action. Science uses the term "energy" to describe the process but in everyday terms, the word we tend to use is "motivation". What usually holds us back from making a departure from the comfort zone is the discomfort that we will feel as we go toward something that is unfamiliar or difficult.



By being afraid and/or unwilling to venture into something new, we sacrifice growth. Growth has to be chosen over and over again to move forward. "One can choose to go back toward safety or forward toward growth. Growth must be chosen again and again; fear must be overcome again and again" (Abraham Maslow).

• Fear/complacency is keeping you from growth: The primary ingredient to move forward is "moving". Growth is about progress. Progress is about movement. And movement is stepping into something that is unfamiliar/difficult. Move yourself forward by trying new things and the attempt to master them.

• It keeps you from trying new things: Getting outside your comfort zone provides opportunity to discover new interests and even those few things we are passionate about. It takes time to discover what you love but unless you try new things, you'll never know what you like and what you don't.

• It conditions you to settle: By settling, you have deprived yourself of experiences that could have a profound influence on your life. Even worse, in the future when you have an amazing opportunity and refuse to leave your

bubble of comfort, you may not reach for it and instead, settle for mediocrity. "The only person you are destined to become is the person you decide to be" (Ralph Waldo Emerson).

So, how do you get started? With patience and perseverance, you can begin to take action.

- Make a list: No matter how small, write down the things you need/want to accomplish.
- **Do one or more of the smallest items on your list:** Take on the smallest task that you have resisted doing and go do it. Then another and so on down the list.
- Keep taking steps: By accomplishing a simple task and stepping outside your comfort zone, you gain confidence and synergy to continue with more difficult tasks and toward success. The more you do it, the easier it becomes. Keep taking small steps growth will occur, you'll become more confident, go after your goals, and acquire the intrinsic satisfaction of accomplishment and a job well done.



- Fill out the Register New Household Information. Select a Primary Profile Access PIN which is needed to enter the primary household account. Click LET'S GO (If you get an error message that your email address is already used, go back to the main screen and click on Forgot Password? as some profiles were transferred over from 4HOnline.com)
- You are now on the Dashboard screen. Click + HOUSEHOLD MEMBER Enter the First Name, Last Name, Role (Member or Volunteer), and Member's Birthday. You may choose a preloaded avatar or upload a personal photo by clicking CHOOSE PICTURE. Click CONTINUE
- Select the PERSONAL INFO tab. All fields marked with an asterisk (*) are required. Click NEXT to get to the WAIVERS tab.
- Select the WAIVERS tab. Click ↓ next to each section to sign off on all the waivers. (You must agree in order to proceed.) On the Health Form, put N/A or none if the required field does not apply to your member. Click NEXT to get to the CLUBS tab.

NATRONA COUNTY 4-H YOUTH HORSE SUPERINTENDENT DESCRIPTION

Purpose

To provide a positive learning experience for 4-H and FFA members and volunteers, and promoting a positive image of 4-H and FFA to the public.

Accountability

To work with supervision and direction of the Natrona County 4-H Educator to organize, coordinate, and evaluate their particular livestock species project. To be accountable to the Natrona County Extension Educator and/or fair management.

Selection Procedures

Superintendent position vacancies will be announced in the 4-H newsletter. An application, provided in the newsletter and at the 4-H office, must be filled out and delivered to the 4-H office by the appropriate deadline as advertised in the newsletter/email. The final selection of the superintendent(s) will be determined by the Natrona County 4-H Educator.

Eligibility and Qualifications

Knowledge of the 4-H project area sufficient to ensure consistency between the project area, fair guidelines, judging, exhibition and livestock sale.

- A sincere interest in working with other volunteers and professional staff in an educational setting and a willingness to become familiar with and work within the philosophy and guidelines of the University of Wyoming Extension and the Natrona County 4-H program.
- Year-round position with appointment beginning October 1 September 30 with most responsibilities relating to the Horse Show in July.
- The ability to work with minimal supervision but openly communicate with the 4-H Educator and staff in a timely manner
- The ability to motivate youth and adults to assume leadership positions through delegation.
- The ability to utilize conflict resolution skills.
- The ability to work tactfully and communicate effectively verbally and in written forms.
- The ability to organize information and materials and delegate responsibility.
- The ability to accept and follow through with responsibilities.
- The ability to make decisions in context with 4-H policies, the CWF fair book rules and with consultation of the Natrona County 4-H Extension Educator.
- Familiarity with the CWF.
- To be familiar with the project area as listed in the Fair Book.

Responsibilities

- Follow all guidelines and policies of the University of Wyoming Extension 4-H and conduct activities in a safe and healthy manner and enforcing the 4-H Code of Conduct.
- Maintain the standards of the 4-H program by conducting oneself in a responsible manner and honor confidentiality.
- Serve as a role model and willingly share knowledge and involve youth and adults in the program.
- Maintain close contact with Extension staff and FFA advisors.
- To coordinate Vet check procedure.

Early in Calendar Year (October 1 – September 30)

- Attend pre-fair meetings.
- Contact new sponsors, if needed.
- Work with the horse committee to suggest changes in the fair book and/or show procedure. The horse committee will consist of registered 4-H/FFA youth, registered 4-H leaders/FFA advisors, and parents/guardians of registered 4-H/FFA youth registered in the horse project and will have the opportunity to vote at the committee meeting(s).
- Suggesting changes in the fair book and/or show procedure. Requirements for the project are determined by the Horse committee with final approval from the NC 4-H Educator. The CWF Show committee has the final authority regarding changes to the event.
- Organize a class(es) or clinic(s) on date of choice. Be available to confer on horse-related issue(s) throughout the year.

Pre-fair

- Follow 4-H deadlines
- Assist exhibitors in following bio-security guidelines.

<u>Show</u>

- Superintendent is to be present during arrival and departure times.
- Be available to answer questions from exhibitors, parents, leaders, and Extension staff.
- Support herdsmanship and appropriate animal welfare practices for positive public display.
- Follow bio-security guidelines.
- Follow the CWF fair book rules.

Show Day

- Prior to the show, get ribbons, prizes, and judging book from the 4-H office.
- For the show, designate:
 - announcer
 - person to check exhibitors in
 - -ring person(s) to help exhibitors
- -person(s) to pick up ribbons and prizes and organize judging area (table, signs, pens/pencils, chairs, etc.)
- -person(s) to record ribbon placings
- -person(s) to present ribbons and prizes
- Greet and orient the judge(s) when he/she arrives at the show

Post Fair

- Organize and chair horse committee meetings, as needed
- Attend/organize post-fair evaluation meeting or designate a person from your committee.


