SPARK OPPortunity...a term you'll be seeing and hearing frequently in this new 4-H year.



4-H programs are developed in the **belief that kids learn best by doing**.
4-H kids complete hands-on projects in areas like science, health, agriculture, civic engagement, and more.

*Sparks* are what help youth see the potential within themselves. Sparking their inner passions, interests and talents that inspire them on the path to thriving is central to youth development work.

Sparking the passions and interests of youth goes beyond project and club program involvement.

In the world of positive youth development research, there is growing evidence of key developmental assets that help youth thrive rather than simply "get by." Dr. Peter Benson from the Search Institute describe this passion as one's "spark." Sparks are what help youth see the potential within themselves "sparking" their interests and talents that inspire them on the path to thriving which is central to youth development work.

Sparks are activities and interests that brings out a person's energy and joy, allowing them to express their personality and contribute to the world. This can be something they're good at and/or already participate in (like playing the piano, skiing, dance, sports, or painting), or something you care a lot about (like community involvement), or a quality (like helping others). But how does someone find their spark?

The path to finding one's *spark* starts with exploration – 4-H'ers have an opportunity to explore and find their *spark* through their club and project work. Through the club, they spend time with others of varying ages in the community. With the wide variety of project areas, 4-H helps youth find their *spark* in different areas of interest from citizenship to STEM to animal science.

Be watching throughout the 2021 – 2022 NC 4-H year for SPARK OPPortunities (SPARK OPP's) that will be organized through the 4-H office. Take the opportunity to learn something new and explore something that piques your interest!



To provide a positive learning experience for 4-H and FFA members and volunteers, and promoting a positive image of 4-H and FFA to the public.

#### Accountability

To work with supervision and direction of the Natrona County 4-H Educator to organize, coordinate, and evaluate their particular livestock species project. To be accountable to the Natrona County Extension Educator and/or fair management.

#### **Selection Procedures**

Superintendent position vacancies will be announced in the 4-H newsletter. An application, provided in the newsletter and at the 4-H office, must be filled out and delivered to the 4-H office by the appropriate deadline as advertised in the newsletter. The final selection of the superintendent will be determined by the Natrona County 4-H Educator.

#### **Eligibility and Qualifications**

Knowledge of the 4-H project area sufficient to ensure consistency between the project area, fair guidelines, judging, exhibition and livestock sale.

- A sincere interest in working with other volunteers and professional staff in an
  educational setting and a willingness to become familiar with and work within the
  philosophy and guidelines of the University of Wyoming Extension and the Natrona
  County 4-H program.
- Year-round position with appointment beginning October 1 September 30 with most responsibilities relating to the CWF in July.
- The ability to work with minimal supervision but openly communicate with the 4-H Educator and staff in a respectful and timely manner.
- The ability to motivate youth and adults to assume leadership positions through delegation.
- The ability to utilize conflict resolution skills.
- The ability to work tactfully and communicate effectively verbally and in written forms.
- The ability to organize information and materials and delegate responsibility.
- The ability to accept and follow through with responsibilities.
- The ability to make decisions in context with 4-H policies, the CWF fair book rules and with consultation of the Natrona County 4-H Extension Educator.

- Familiarity with the CWF.
- To be familiar with the project area as listed in the Fair Book.
- Be an enrolled 4-H leader or willing to become an enrolled 4-H leader.

#### Responsibilities

- Follow all guidelines and policies of the University of Wyoming Extension 4-H and conduct activities in a safe and healthy manner and enforcing the 4-H Code of Conduct.
- Maintain the standards of the 4-H program by conducting oneself in a responsible manner and honor confidentiality.
- Serve as a role model, willingly share knowledge and involve youth and adults in the program.
- Maintain close contact with Extension staff, FFA advisors, and communicate and cooperate with all species superintendents.
- To coordinate their species project area and fairly assign cages, pens, and/or stalls.
- Supervise assigned livestock area at the CWF.
- To coordinate your species weigh-in, tagging procedures, and coordinate an appropriate number of volunteers to assist with weigh-in and tagging procedures.
- To be present on Vet Check day and be in their assigned area within the Arena or Swine Barn by 7 a.m.
- As necessary, assist with Jr. Livestock Sale, load-outs, and trucking of sale animals.

#### Early in Calendar Year (October 1 - September 30)

- Attend pre-fair meetings.
- Contact new sponsors, as needed.
- Conduct fund raisers, as needed.
- Work with the specific species committee of which you are superintendent in suggested changes in the fair book and/or show procedure. Each individual species committee will consist of registered 4-H/FFA youth, registered 4-H leaders/FFA advisors, and parents/guardians of registered 4-H/FFA youth registered in the beef, swine, goat, sheep, alpaca, rabbit or poultry project and will have the opportunity to vote at the committee meeting(s).
- Organize and supervise weigh-ins and tagging held in advance of fair, if applicable.
- Organize a class(es) or clinic(s) on date of choice or during one of the Expos held by the
   4-H office.
- Be available to confer on species-related issue(s) throughout the year.

#### Pre-fair

- Follow 4-H deadlines.
- Assist exhibitors in following bio-security guidelines.

#### Fair Week

- Superintendent is to be present during livestock arrival and departure times.
- Supervise fair weigh-in, if applicable.
- Routinely check species area for livestock health concerns. Report concerns to the 4-H
   Educator and/or FFA advisor. The Animal Health Committee may need to be notified.
- Be available to answer questions from exhibitors, parents, leaders, and Extension staff.
- Support herdsmanship and appropriate animal welfare practices for positive public display.
- Attend daily Superintendent meetings.
- Follow bio-security guidelines.
- Follow the CWF fair book rules.

#### **Show Day**

- Prior to the show, get ribbons, prizes, and judging book from the 4-H office between the hours of 8 a.m. 5 p.m.
- For the show, designate:
  - ring announcer
  - person to check 4-H and FFA exhibitors in
  - -ring person(s) to help exhibitors
  - -person(s) to pick up ribbons and prizes and organize judging area (table, signs, pens/pencils, chairs, etc.)
  - -person(s) to record ribbon placings
  - -person(s) to present ribbons and prizes
- Greet and orient the judge when he/she arrives at the show ring

#### Post Fair

- Organize and chair species committee meetings, as needed
- Attend post-fair evaluation meeting or designate a person from your specie committee.




