#### The Success of Your 4-H Experience is Up-To-You....

#### 1. Craft a Vision...

The first step is **to get clear on what is most important to you**. This is all about figuring out what you want out of the next year of your life. Take some time to think about what it you is want to accomplish over the next year and beyond and where you want to go.

2. Get clear on why you want it...

Now that you've crafted a compelling vision (I.E. decided what you want your goals to look like), you need to get really clear on why you want it. A compelling vision can only motivate you to the degree that you're in tune with why you want it, so you need to take the time to get really clear about **why** you want what you want.

3. Create a plan to execute your goal...

If you have a compelling vision and know your 'why', you need to create a relevant plan that allows you to take action in the most effective way possible towards that vision. Break down your goal into reasonable and believable chunks that highlight a clear path to your goal.

4. Develop a system for helping you stick with it...

An extension of your plan, an accountability system takes over where your plan leaves off. Start off by setting smaller weekly goals based on your quarterly goals. You can gauge your performance on a weekly basis and make notes on how you can improve, staying on track every step of the way. In addition, this kind of system really helps you up your game over the long run by making small weekly or monthly improvements.

5. Allow yourself to fail (and know what to do when you fall off)...

It's important to differentiate between quitting and failing. Quitting means you're done. It means you tried to realize your vision and no longer felt you could hit your goal and decided not to pursue it any longer. Failing means you tried to accomplish some aspect of your dream or goal and didn't. With

failing, you have the opportunity to try again another way. Quitting means you're done. Oftentimes, we accomplish our goals in a way we never imagined. You can't plan for what life throws at you, but you can get back up, adapt, and move forward.


So, how do you get started? With patience and perseverance, you can begin to take action.

- 1. Make a list: No matter how small, write down the things you need/want to accomplish.
- 2. Do one or more of the smallest items on your list: Take on the smallest task that you have resisted doing and go do it. Then another and so on down the list.
- 3. Keep taking steps: By accomplishing a simple task and stepping outside your comfort zone, you gain confidence and synergy to continue with more difficult tasks and toward success. The more you do it, the easier it becomes. Keep taking small steps growth will occur, you'll become more confident, go after your goals, and acquire the intrinsic satisfaction of accomplishment and a job well done.

## Natrona County Assistant Barn Superintendent Description

#### **Purpose**

To provide a positive learning experience for 4-H and FFA members and volunteers, and promoting a positive image of 4-H and FFA to the public.

#### Accountability

To work with supervision and direction of the Natrona County 4-H Educator and CWF Fair manager to organize, coordinate, and be accountable to the Natrona County Extension Educator and Fair Manager.

#### **Selection Procedures**

Lead Superintendent position vacancies will be announced in the 4-H newsletter. An application, provided in the newsletter and at the 4-H office, must be filled out and delivered to the 4-H office by the appropriate deadline as advertised in the newsletter. The final selection of the superintendent will be determined by the Natrona County 4-H Educator and the CWF Fair Manager.

#### **Eligibility and Qualifications**

Knowledge of the 4-H projects sufficient to ensure consistency with the static and livestock superintendents.

- A sincere interest in working with other volunteers and professional staff in an educational setting and a willingness to become familiar with and work within the philosophy and guidelines of the University of Wyoming Extension and the Natrona County 4-H program. To be directed by the Lead Superintendent.
- Year-round position with appointment beginning October 1 September 30 with most responsibilities relating to the CWF in July.
- The ability to work with minimal supervision but openly communicate with the 4-H Educator, Fair Manager, and staff in a timely manner
- The ability to motivate youth and adults to assume leadership positions through delegation.
- The ability to utilize conflict resolution skills.
- The ability to work tactfully and communicate effectively verbally and in written forms.
- The ability to organize information and materials and delegate responsibility.
- The ability to accept and follow through with responsibilities.
- The ability to make decisions in context with 4-H policies, the CWF Fair Book rules and with consultation of the Natrona County 4-H Extension Educator and CWF Fair Manager.
- Familiarity with the CWF.
- To be familiar with the project areas as listed in the Fair Book.

#### **Responsibilities and Duties**

- Coordinate building security including the opening and closing of the Arena and Swine Barn each morning and night.
- Coordinate building security including the opening and closing of the Hall of Champions.
- One Lead Superintendent or Asst. Lead Superintendent must be available or on call at all times during Fair Week.
- Be the initial support for the individual superintendents in the static and livestock projects.
- Primary liaison with the CWF Fair Manager and University of Wyoming Extension staff.
- Follow all guidelines and policies of the University of Wyoming Extension 4-H, CWF fair book, and conduct activities in a safe and healthy manner and enforcing the 4-H Code of Conduct.
- Maintain the standards of the 4-H program by conducting oneself in a responsible manner and honor confidentiality.
- Serve as a role model and willingly share knowledge and involve youth and adults in the program and assist in addressing exhibitor and the public's concerns.
- Maintain close contact with Extension staff, FFA advisors, and the CWF Fair Manager
- To be present on Load In day and be in the Arena or Swine Barn by 7 a.m.
- As necessary, assist with Jr. Livestock Sale, load-outs, and trucking of sale animals.

#### Early in Calendar Year (October 1 – September 30)

Attend pre-fair meetings.

#### Pre-fair

- Follow 4-H deadlines.
- Assist exhibitors in following bio-security guidelines.

#### Fair Week

- Routinely check for livestock health concerns.
- Routinely check security in Hall of Champions.
- Be available to answer questions from exhibitors, parents, leaders, and Extension staff.
- Support herdsmanship and appropriate animal welfare practices for positive public display.
- Be the initial support for the individual superintendents in the static and livestock projects.
- Serve as a role model and willingly share knowledge and involve youth and adults in the program and assist in addressing exhibitor and the public's concerns.
- Attend daily Superintendent meetings.
- Follow bio-security guidelines.
- Follow the CWF Fair Book rules.



- **Hands**: Learning new skills, improving skills already developed, instilling pride in work, and earning respect of work accomplished.


**Health**: Practicing healthful living, protecting the wellbeing of self and others, and making constructive use of leisure time.

#### **SAFE FOOD HANDLING FOR PRODUCE:**

Prepare raw produce with food safety in mind







Wash your hands first.

Rinse fresh fruits and vegetables under cool, running, clean water even if you do not plan to eat the skin or rind.





Never use soap, detergent, or bleach solution to wash fresh fruits or vegetables. They can affect flavor and may not be safe to ingest.

Avoid cross-contamination when preparing fruits and vegetables.




