into winners in all walks of life, it's in and around a show ring.

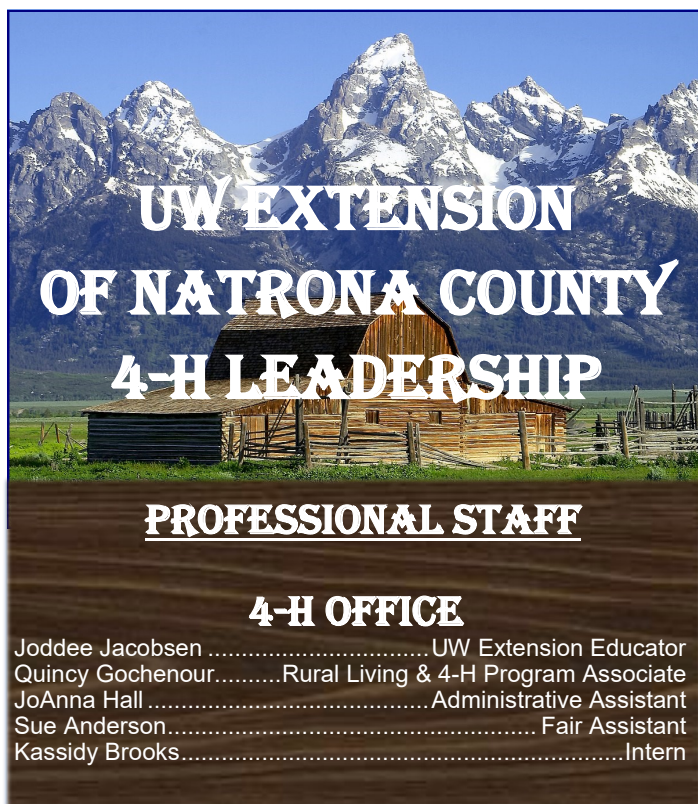
So, let's encourage kids to be winners. Not so they can have the most awards, but to create a world of champions that will stop at nothing short of success.

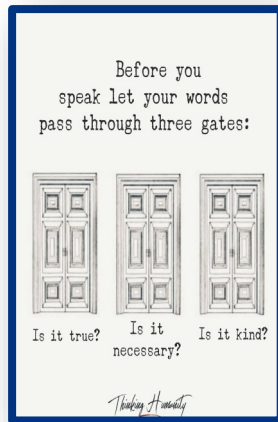

\$\$\$ THE PROCESS OF GETTING YOU PAID \$\$\$

SALE CHECKS ARE PREPARED AFTER THESE CONDITIONS ARE MET:

- Your Buyer has paid for your animal.
- We have received proof of slaughter/delivery.
- You have written a "Thank You" note ready to be mailed in a stamped envelope addressed to your buyer. All thank you notes must be turned in to the 4-H Office by Wednesday, August 31, 2022, at 4:30 p.m.
- 4-H Members must submit their 4-H record books electronically through ZSuite. The last day to submit your online record book is Wednesday, August 31, 2022, by 11:59 p.m. (*No paper Record Books for 4-H members*)
- FFA Members must submit their FFA record books electronically to their respective FFA advisor by Wednesday, August 31, 2022, at 4:30 p.m. Failure to do so will result in penalties outlined in the 2022 Fair Book.

PLEASE REMEMBER:

- It takes several weeks for checks to clear the bank and all the necessary paperwork to be done on your sale of your animal; therefore, please do not call the 4-H Office to ask if your check is ready. Your check will be mailed directly to you by the Central Wyoming Junior Livestock Sale Committee after Wednesday, August 31, 2022.
- Wyoming State Fair animal checks will not be available until at least mid-September. If you deliver your Wyoming State Fair animal to the processing facility, you must bring a signed receipt from the facility to the 4-H Office.

Where will you be going with your animals?

***Health requirements must meet the requirements of the state you are entering.

INTERstate movement - is transporting livestock across state lines. Wyoming entry requires:

-  Sheep need a C.V.I. and a brand inspection
-  Cattle need a C.V.I. and a brand inspection
-  Swine need a C.V.I.
-  Goats need a C.V.I.

INTRAsate movement - is transporting livestock within the state borders. Wyoming requires:



-   Cattle and Sheep need a brand inspection to cross county line borders.

Note: No C.V.I. is required but some events may have their own participation requirements. Be sure to check.

Brand Inspections:

- Anyone selling, or transporting, cattle or sheep across county or state borders (for any purpose) are required to obtain a brand inspection. Pigs and goats do not need a brand inspection only health inspections.
- If you plan on transporting or selling, livestock contact your county's brand inspector to do a physical inspection of your animal(s) and provide you with the proper brand inspection paper.

In the State of Wyoming there are different brand inspection options depending on the purpose of the movement(s):



Form "A" - a document that is used for intrastate and/or interstate movement of livestock, also issued for a change in ownership.

Good for only one trip.

Cost: \$1.85/cattle, \$0.40/sheep + one trip charge

Form "B"—a document issued at licensed Wyoming livestock markets as a title and clearance to destination.

Cost: \$1.85/cattle, \$0.40/sheep + one trip charge

Form "L" - a document issued as a permanent, lifetime inspection to the owner of livestock used for rodeo, show, pleasure, or work. Is void upon change of ownership.

Cost: \$23.00/per animal + one trip charge

Form "H" - a document issued for intrastate movement of work, show or rodeo stock good for one-year from the date of issue.

Cost: \$16.00/per animal + one trip charge

Each form type has a fee schedule assigned to it. Along with the form fee, brand inspectors charge a **trip charge of \$11.25 for each time they do an inspection. If you are planning on transporting your animal numerous times within the year it may be financially feasible to purchase a form "A" or "H". Discuss the possibilities with your brand inspector.

Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (C.V.I.)

- All producers importing or exporting livestock **into** the State of Wyoming are required to have a C.V.I. from an accredited and licensed veterinarian.
- Animals moving **within** the state do not need a C.V.I. unless the venue they are traveling to requires it. This includes sheep, swine, goats, and cattle.

C.V.I. Requirements:

- Inspections must be completed on each animal.
- Individual identifications must be written on the certificate for each animal.
- All animals must be current on required vaccinations.
- C.V.I. needs to include the Wyoming Entry Permit Number per *Wyo. Livestock Board Rules, Chap 8*. (from the state entering).



EXHIBITORS — Youth exhibiting livestock will need to check with show guidelines to be sure and include any additional special, or required, statements on the C.V.I.

NWF/ NC 4-H Static Projects

-A Number of static projects were not picked up after the fair. These are available at the 4-H office & must be picked up by Thursday, August 4, 2022.

-We will not sort any projects that are eligible for State Fair. However, you may sort them when you pick them up and leave with us to transport to the State Fair in Douglas.

WYOMING 4-H GUIDE TO STATE FAIR

Congratulations on having a project that has qualified for State Fair! Whether you will be attending State Fair or sending a project with your County 4-H Educator, we hope you have had a fun and educational experience while working on your exhibit.

PREPARING

Sending an Exhibit

Project exhibits are due on the State Fairgrounds in either Ft. Caspar or Ft. Reno by Monday, August 15th at 5:00 pm. Judging will begin on Tuesday morning. The buildings will be open to the public starting on Wednesday.

- Exhibits can be dropped off at either building on Monday from 8:00am-5:00 p.m. A permit for vehicle access will not be required on Monday to drop off exhibits.
 - Exhibits will be released Saturday evening at 8:00 pm.
 - All exhibits must be picked up by Sunday at 9:30 am.
- If you will not be attending State Fair, work with your county 4-H Educator regarding drop-off and pick-up times for your project.

Yes! I will be attending State Fair

Your local 4-H educator is responsible for registering the entire county delegation and submitting necessary forms and paperwork for everyone attending. Please work closely with him/her to make sure you are signed up for everything you want to participate in at State Fair.

- Include all livestock information needed.
- Indicate which contests and events in which you will be participating.
 - If competing in the Dog Show and/or Cat Show, additional forms should be submitted.
 - If competing in the Fashion Revue, an online entry form must be completed by Thursday, August 11th.
- Access to the grounds will only be allowed with the proper credentials. This could include paying daily admission at the gate, a commemorative pin, or a dorm wristband.
- All youth and adults staying in the dorms must purchase a dorm wristband which covers the cost of staying in the dorm and gate admission for the full week. Only screened 4-H leaders may stay in the dorms, they will serve as chaperones.
- Meal tickets can be purchased if you would like to eat in the cafeteria throughout the week.

Vehicle Access & Parking

- Any **person** wishing to enter the grounds must have credentials to do so - dorm wristband, commemorative pin, or daily gate admission.
- **Vehicles** may not enter the grounds without a proper permit. Free parking is available in the Pepsi lot.
- **Vehicles** permits include:
 - Dorm parking permit – allows vehicle to be parked in lot behind the dorm.
 - Some complimentary permits will be issued to each county 4-H Educator based on the number of people staying in the dorms.
 - Feed Delivery Vehicle Permit – allows vehicle access to the barns for feeding animals each day from 5:00-9:00 a.m. and 5:00-9:00 p.m.
 - Some permits will be issued to your 4-H Educator based on the number of youth *livestock* exhibitors. Additional permits can be purchased for \$60 each.
 - Livestock Barn Parking Permit- can be purchased for \$80 which allows a vehicle to be parked in designated spots by the livestock barns.
 - Feed Trailer Permit
 - These cannot be purchased. They are issued to the county 4-H Educator based on the number of youth *livestock* exhibitors. Your 4-H Educator will distribute these permits.

Camping

- If you are planning to camp during the week of State Fair, enter the ground through the Pepsi lot, **ALL** campers no matter if they registered online or waiting till State Fair must get their permit at the gate.
- Campers can register online ahead of time or wait till the event (please note if you wait all spaces may be reserved).
- \$40 a night, earliest you can come in for camping is Saturday.
- Spaces are available for tents and camping trailers. Full hook-ups (water, sewer, electricity) are available.
- You will also receive a permit for one (1) vehicle to access and park in the campground.
- There are bathroom and shower facilities available in the campground.

Dorms

- There are very basic amenities available in the dorms. Bathroom and shower facilities as well as bunk beds are available. Plan on bringing anything you will need for the week. Toiletries, towels, sleeping bag, clothes, supplies, etc.
- The dorms will be open Sunday at 6 pm.
- The cost of staying in the dorms is \$60 and wristbands must be purchased through your county Extension Office to stay in the dorms.
- There will be a mandatory meeting in your dorm for everyone to talk about the rules and answer any questions you might have on Monday at 10:30 pm. Be aware of the evening curfews!

Golf Carts

- Golf carts may be used during State Fair. A permit must be purchased and is \$220.
- ATV's are not allowed.

ARRIVAL in Douglas

Welcome! The State 4-H office is located in Ft. Caspar. Feel free to stop by if you have questions or need information. This is also where you can leave messages for your 4-H Educator if necessary.

I don't have any animals...

- Exhibit drop-off (Monday)
 - All 4-H exhibits must be in place in Fort Caspar or Fort Reno by 5:00 p.m. on Monday.
 - Exhibits can be dropped off at either building on Monday from 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.
 - Gate admission is free on Monday.
 - Vehicle access will not be allowed on Tuesday without a permit.
- Livestock Judging (Tuesday)
 - Vehicle access is only allowed with the proper permit. Free parking is available in the Pepsi lot.
- Fashion Revue (Friday & Saturday)
 - If your outfit was judged in Ft. Caspar, you may pick it up and check it out beginning Friday at 9:00 am. It does NOT need to be returned.
 - Vehicle access is only allowed with the proper permit. Free parking is available in the Pepsi lot.
 - The modeling schedule will be posted in Ft. Caspar and online sometime Tuesday.
 - All activities will take place at the Douglas High School. Maps and contest information are available online.
 - The public Fashion Revue will be Saturday at 7:00 pm at the Douglas High School auditorium.

Yes! I'm bringing animals....

- A 4-H and FFA animal exhibitor meeting will be held by State Fair at 7:00 pm on Monday, August 15th, in the cafeteria.
- Make sure you have appropriate paperwork as required by Wyoming state law (vet inspections, health inspections, brand inspections, etc.) for all animals you are bringing on the grounds before you arrive. CVI are NOT required for entrance onto the grounds for YOUTH ANIMALS. This includes animals that are not going to be competing (i.e. the family pet).
- Proceed to the Pepsi lot at the southeast corner of the fairgrounds.
 - ALL ANIMALS are required to go through the Animal Check-In gate at the Pepsi lot.
- After all of your animals have been checked-in, go to the appropriate barn to find your stall(s).
 - Each barn has a superintendent office that can help you locate your stall(s).
- Once you have unloaded everything, all vehicles and trailers must be parked in the Pepsi lot.
 - Work with your educator to determine the best solution for permits allowing future access for vehicles and trailers.

Feed storage

- Feed can be stored in trailers in the specified parking area of the fairgrounds ("Pepsi Lot" on the map).
 - Trailers parked here must have the appropriate Feed Trailer Permit
 - The number of permits is determined by State Fair and based on the number of youth *livestock* exhibitors.
 - These permits will be distributed by your 4-H Educator.
- There will not be enough permits for each family to park their trailer there. Exhibitors will have to work with their 4-H educator to determine who will park there and how feed will be stored.

Feed delivery

- Vehicles used to deliver feed must have the proper permit.
 - You might receive one of these from your 4-H Educator or additional permits are available for \$50 each.
 - Vehicle access with correct permit is only allowed each day 5:00-9:00 a.m. and 5:00-9:00 p.m.
 - After you have fed your animals, you will proceed back towards West Yellowstone street and proceed to the appropriate location to park your vehicle.
- An entrance is located near the feed trailer parking lot and is for *pedestrian traffic only*. Use of this entrance will require proper gate admission credentials for entry.

Animal Drop-Off & Pick-Up for Dog, Rabbit, Horse, Poultry, Cat & Pocket Pet Shows

- They will only be issued at this location to vehicles with the youth AND his/her animal(s) present.
- Vehicle may not park on the fairgrounds. The permit is only for access to drop-off and pick-up animals before and after the show.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Where is the State 4-H Office?

The State 4-H Office and information desk are located in Fort Caspar. Feel free to stop by and ask questions or get more information if necessary.

How do I get my wristband/gate pin/parking permit/meal ticket, etc?

Your 4-H Educator will pick up this information sometime on Monday. Often counties will meet as a group to get these items distributed. Communicate with your educator prior to arriving at State Fair so you know what the plan is. The first meal in the cafeteria is breakfast on Monday night.

How can I contact my 4-H Educator during State Fair?

1. You may leave a note in his/her mail box in Fort Caspar.
2. If it is an emergency, you may ask someone from the State 4-H Office to contact them via phone. Cell phone numbers will not be given out under any circumstance.

How do I gain access to the grounds?

Credentials are necessary for anyone to gain access to the fairgrounds. Youth 5 and under are free of charge when accompanied by an adult. Acceptable gate admission includes a commemorative pin, dorm wristband, or daily ticket.

Vehicles may not access or park on the fairgrounds without a proper permit.

How do I know if I have been entered in the correct classes?

Call sheets are typically printed and posted somewhere for each animal-related show. If you see an error, find the 4-H Educator who is helping at that particular show and ask them for help. They will be able to get in touch with your 4-H Educator and find out the correct information.

When can I see the results for my exhibits in Ft. Caspar or Ft. Reno?

All exhibits are due in these buildings no later than 5:00 p.m. on Monday. Judging will take place on Tuesday and the buildings will be open on Wednesday morning for display. Results for division champions are recorded and will be posted online after State Fair. You can see how your exhibit placed during open building hours, specific results will not be recorded and posted for non-champion exhibits.

Can I help with something?

We are always looking for youth and volunteers who are interested in helping at State Fair! A large number of people are needed on Tuesday to help with exhibit judging in Ft. Reno and Ft. Caspar. If you're interested, please email 4H@uwyo.edu and let us know or stop by the 4-H office in Ft. Caspar!

Information about your project

Due to the absence of interview judging at State Fair, the accompaniment of a brief explanation with projects may help the judge when assigning a ribbon placing. Items to consider may include: process, tools used, skills learned, goals achieved, additional help from others, etc.

All exhibits are due by 5:00 p.m. on Monday in either Ft. Caspar or Ft. Reno. Use the lists below to sort through your entries.

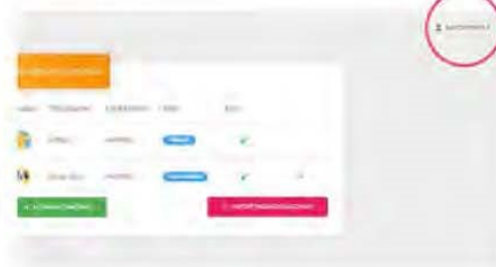

There are also categories for club secretary, treasurer and news reporter that will also be judged.

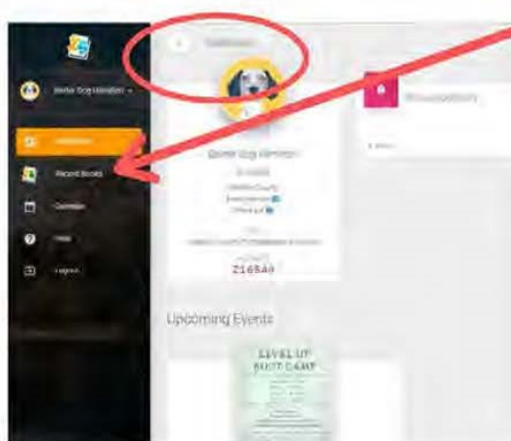

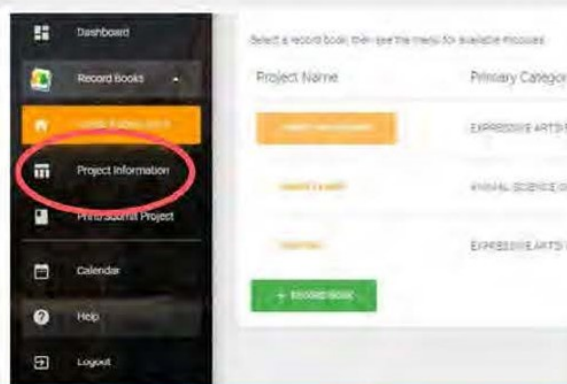
Editing a Record Book/Adding Goals

WRITING BLUE RIBBON “THANK YOU” LETTERS!

When should “thank you” letters be sent?

In 4-H, you will most often write “thank you” letters when you earn a sponsored award and when you sell a market animal. A thank you letter should be sent to award sponsors and auction buyers to express your appreciation of their generosity and support. Letters should be written and mailed immediately after receiving the donation (no more than two weeks later).

What should they look like?

The best “thank you” letters are written on paper or inside personalized cards. They should always be handwritten in your very best handwriting! **Envelopes should be addressed properly in your handwriting.**

What should be included?

1. **Salutation:** Be sure you personalize the letter and spell donor names correctly. If an individual made the donation, write “Dear Mr. XXXXX” or “Dear Ms. XXXXX.” If a business made the donation, call to find out who at that business should receive your letter and use their name in your salutation rather than writing it to the business name. **Writing “Dear Sponsor” or “Dear Buyer” is never okay!**
2. **Introduce yourself:** Give your full name, your age or grade, tell them you are a 4-H member, your project area, and which club you are in.
3. **Express gratitude and name the donation:** The second sentence should thank the donor and remind them what they did. For example, “Thank you for purchasing my pig at this year’s fair auction.” Or, “Thank you for sponsoring the award for Grand Champion Market Steer at this year’s fair.”
4. **Tell how the donation will be used:** Let the donor know what you plan to do with the money received from auction or how you will use the award they donated so they know how appreciative you are. This should be personalized, like “The money I earned at the auction will be used to pay for college in the future.” Or, “The rope halter you donated will be used to train my next market animal.”
5. **Repeat your appreciation:** Reinforce your gratitude to the donor. You could say, “Thanks again for supporting the 4-H program.” Or, “Your generosity is very much appreciated.”
6. **Sign your name:** At the bottom of your letter, write “Sincerely,” and sign your name.

How can I elaborate?

The sections above are the bare minimum for what should be included in your letter. You are encouraged to elaborate and further personalize your letter. Additional things you could include are: a personal connection you have to the business or donor, how many years you’ve been in 4-H, why the 4-H program means so much to you, your goals for the next year, something interesting about your project, why you appreciate what they did, why 4-H benefits from donations like theirs, or elaborate on what you did to earn the donation.

Samples

Basic Letter:

Dear Mr. Jones,

My name is Jane Doe and I'm a 4th grader in the Bodacious Buckaroos 4-H horse club. Thank you for sponsoring the award for Junior Showmanship Champion. I am excited to use the saddle blanket you donated when I show at fair next year. Thanks again for supporting the 4-H program!

Jane Doe

Elaborated Letter:

Dear Ms. Jones and Jones' Construction Company,

My name is John Doe, I'm a 17 year old 4-H member and I have been showing goats with the Livestock Lifers club for the past 8 years. Thank you so much for purchasing my market goat at this year's fair auction! The money I earned from selling my goat will go into my college fund and help me pay tuition at Oregon State University in the future. 4-H has taught me so much over the years and it's support from business owners like you that allow 4-H to continue helping so many kids in our county. Thanks again, your generosity is very much appreciated!

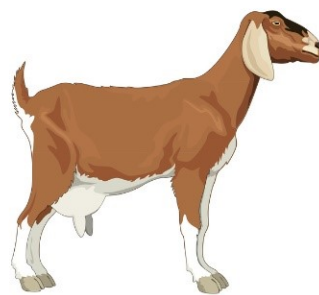
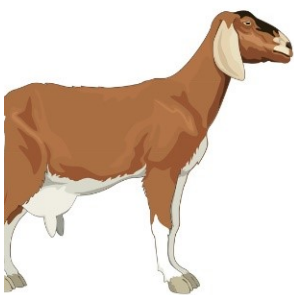

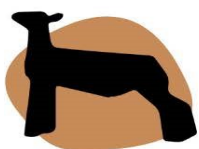
