4-H Families,

It is exciting to think that August has arrived and that youth can prepare for and take part in the state fair. This year at the state fair I am happy to be helping with the management of 4-H Foods Exhibits. We work with the judges and then set up the food exhibits for display at the Wyoming State Fair. I am also happy to assist with 4-H Swine Projects as the State Fair 4-H Swine Liaison. I look forward to connecting with many youth, leaders, and educators from across the state.

I would like to take some time to offer some encouragement to all leaders or parents interested in becoming leaders. The Wyoming 4-H program wants to support you in all that you are doing to make Wyoming 4-H the stellar youth development organization. The Wyoming 4-H Volunteer Summit is a way to learn and grow as a leader within Wyoming 4-H. The Volunteer Summit will be September $27^{\text{th}} - 29^{\text{th}}$ in Casper, Wyoming.

Reasons to Attend:

• There is always a new idea, concept, or experience to learn from. Recently, I saw an episode of the show Lessons in Chemistry where the wife criticizes her husband for reading the book Great Expectations repeatedly.

"How many times can you read *Great Expectations*?" she said. "How many times have you made the same lasagna?" He asks.

She responds directly, "That is not a fair comparison because the Lasagna is a little different each time."

"The book stays the same but you don't." he answers.

The Volunteer Summit has both new and similar offerings to what you might have learned before. You are a different person with different experiences and understandings from the last time that you took a volunteer training. It is still worth doing again.

• Place importance on being a vested leader and involved with other caring leaders.

"We don't need a title to lead. We just need to be care. People would rather follow a leader with a heart than a leader with a title." – Craig Groeschel.

4-H leaders are volunteer leaders because they deeply care about the youth that they serve. Connecting in a setting where that is the mutual goal is a great way to grow as a leader.

• Natrona County 4-H Leaders get a perk. The Natrona County 4-H Council will pay for ½ of the registration fee for every Natrona County 4-H Leader that goes to the Leader's Summitt.

Again, the registration is only \$100 (\$50 to Natrona County Leaders) to join a fun weekend of leadership development. I look forward to seeing you there as I am the chair of the food and accommodations committee that will help with planning this event.


