



# -H Project Success: What steps should I follow?

- 1. Select project areas that interest you.
- 2. Make sure you are signed up in ZSUITE for your chosen projects.
- 3. Come up with a project that will help you reach your learning goals. (For example, if you signed up for Sport Fishing and set the goal of learning new casting techniques. A poster with the steps you took to learn the new techniques would be great for the fair.
- 4. Use 4-H Project Curriculum to help you come up with project ideas and learning goals. 4-H Project Curriculum are "workbooks" that kids can do independently or with an adult mentor. They allow youth to go at their own pace and achieve hands-on learning independently. Curriculum can be checked out from the Natrona County Extension Office or purchased at shop4-h.org.
- 5. Begin work in your 4-H project area. Be sure to keep notes when you work on projects, including when you learned things and what you learned, what didn't go as planned, when you shared your project with someone else, etc. Don't forget to take pictures! Later, these notes can be transferred on to your 4-H Record Book.
- 6. Attend any project workshops that may be held in the project areas that you signed up for. Watch the NC 4-H Facebook page, newsletter, and emails sent out from the Extension Office for more information it always includes details of upcoming 4-H activities that are being offered to 4-H members.
- 7. Remember that you should be completing projects as a way to reach the learning goals you have set for yourself not just making something to bring to the fair.
- 8. Call the 4-H Office for help if you get confused, stuck, or run out of ideas! We'd love to help you with ideas.

# Especially for Volunteers...

4-H Youth Development - The Club System

- The 4-H club is the core structure where hands-on learning and teaching take place. An organized group of at least five youth, from at least two different families, meet with adult volunteers. With appropriate guidance from volunteers, club members elect their own officers, decide on programs and plan activities.
- It's entirely up to 4-H members what their 4-H club does! 4-H clubs usually focus on one or more topics of the members' choice.
   They conduct project-related activities, for example, a club may have a year-round garden or a shooting sports club may practice at the range.
   4-H clubs also do lots of community service both in their project area and where they are needed.
- The purpose of 4-H is to promote positive youth development. If club members and volunteers plan a wide variety of learning activities together, everyone has the chance to grow through experiential learning, developing individual skills and abilities, and participating in community service projects.

The 4-H program year runs October 1 through the following September. Membership in Wyoming 4-H is open to all youth ages 8-18 (age as of January 1), regardless of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, marital status, disability, or public assistance. Children ages 5-7 can participate with selected age-appropriate activities through the Cloverbud program.

# 4-H Club Meetings That Youth Choose to Attend

A 4-H Club is a great venue for learning, group interaction and fun to take place. The meeting environment and meeting components are important aspects to consider when creating a club that youth choose to attend.

**4-H Club Meeting Environment:** The Environment of a club meeting includes all of the things that make people feel comfortable when they attend.

- Location and Room Set Up: Is your meeting in an easy location to find and get to? If it is not near an outside door, are there signs to guide people? Is the room comfortable? There are a number of ways to set up the room to facilitate your meeting. If you want better discussion, consider putting the chairs in a circle or horseshoe. This arrangement facilitates conversation/business, and the 4-H members can see each other which will help them get to know one another. The members are more apt to stay attentive throughout the meeting as it is more difficult to withdraw or space out without being noticed.
- Making Families Feel Welcome: Greeting people when they first enter the room is a way of making people feel welcome. It can be intimidating to go into a place where you do not know anyone, so that greeting can break the ice. Likewise, even for current member families it is nice to be greeted when you walk in the door. Nametags are a great idea to help people get acquainted. It helps everyone learn names. Clip on nametags for all members and their parents could be in the meeting supply box.
- New Families: May not know the 4-H Pledge, the 4-H Motto or even the procedure that is followed at a 4-H club meeting. Consider
  a "Greet Sheet" with some of those basic instructions. Also consider putting signs or banner up in the meeting room to help with the
  pledge, motto, agenda...
- Getting People Involved Right Away: If a family arrives a little early, what is there to do while they wait? What kinds of things can
  you have going on prior to club meetings to promote and encourage people being on time? IDEAS Judging classes, puzzles, games,
  worksheets, learning centers, project displays, a sign in sheet or sign-up poster for future activities.

### **Selection Procedures**

Asst. Superintendent position vacancies will be announced in the 4-H newsletter and/or email. An application, provided in the newsletter and at the 4-H office, must be filled out and delivered to the 4-H office by the appropriate deadline as advertised in the newsletter and/or email. The final selection of the superintendent will be determined by the Natrona County 4-H Educator.

### **Eligibility and Qualifications**

Knowledge of the 4-H project area sufficient to ensure consistency between the project area, fair guidelines, judging, exhibition and livestock sale.

- -A sincere interest in working with other volunteers and professional staff in an educational setting and a willingness to become familiar with and work within the philosophy and guidelines of the University of Wyoming Extension and the Natrona County 4-H program.
- -Year-round position with appointment beginning October 1 September 30 with most responsibilities relating to the CWF in July.
- -The ability to work with minimal supervision but openly communicate with the 4-H Educator and staff in a timely manner
- -The ability to motivate youth and adults to assume leadership positions through delegation.
- -The ability to utilize conflict resolution skills.
- -The ability to work tactfully and communicate effectively verbally and in written forms.
- -The ability to organize information and materials and delegate responsibility.
- -The ability to accept and follow through with responsibilities.
- -The ability to make decisions in context with 4-H policies, the CWF fair book rules and with consultation of the Natrona County 4-H Extension Educator.
- -Familiarity with the CWF.
- -To be familiar with the project area as listed in the Fair Book.
- -Be an enrolled 4-H leader or willing to become an enrolled 4-H leader.

### Responsibilities

- -Follow all guidelines and policies of the University of Wyoming Extension 4-H and conduct activities in a safe and healthy manner and enforcing the 4-H Code of Conduct.
- -Maintain the standards of the 4-H program by conducting oneself in a responsible manner and honor confidentiality.
- -Serve as a role model, willingly share knowledge and involve youth and adults in the program.
- -Maintain close contact with Extension staff, FFA advisors, and communicate and cooperate with all species superintendents.
- -To coordinate their species project area and fairly assign pens.
- -Supervise assigned livestock area at the CWF.
- -To coordinate an appropriate number of volunteers to assist.
- -To be present on Load-in day and be in their assigned area within the Arena.

Conduct fund raisers, as needed.

Organize a class(es) or clinic(s) on date of choice.

Be available to confer on species-related issue(s) throughout the year.

### Pre-fair

### Fair Week

Asst. Superintendent is to be present during livestock arrival and departure times.

Routinely check species area for livestock health concerns. Report concerns to the Alpaca Superintendent,

4-H Educator and/or FFA advisor. The Animal Health Committee may need to be notified.

Be available to answer questions from exhibitors, parents, leaders, and Extension staff.

Support herdsmanship and appropriate animal welfare practices for positive public display.

Attend daily Superintendent meetings.

Follow bio-security guidelines.

Follow the CWF fair book rules.

### **Show Day**

Prior to the show, get ribbons, prizes, and judging book from the fairgrounds 4-H office.

For the show, designate:

- ring announcer
- person to check 4-H and FFA exhibitors in
- -ring person(s) to help exhibitors
- -person(s) to pick up ribbons and prizes and organize judging area (table, signs, pens/pencils, chairs, etc.)
- -person(s) to record ribbon placings

Set up and clean up your judging/showing area.

Greet and orient the judges when he/she arrives to judge.

There will be a short judges/clerks meeting before judging at the Hall of Champions in the 4-H Fair office.




