you have taken in is where the reflection starts and the true growth happens.


Growth: *noun:* The act or process, or a manner of growing; development; gradual increase: size or stage of development.



SALE CHECKS ARE PREPARED AFTER THESE CONDITIONS ARE MET: • Your Buyer has paid for your animal.

- We have received proof of slaughter/delivery.
- You have written a "Thank You" note ready to be mailed in a stamped envelope addressed to your buyer. All thank you notes must be turned in to the 4-H Office by Wednesday, August 31, 2022, at 4:30 p.m.
- 4-H Members must submit their 4-H record books <u>electronically</u> through ZSuite. The last day to submit your online record book is Wednesday, August 31, 2022, by 11:59 p.m. (No paper Record Books for 4-H members)
- FFA Members must submit their FFA record books electronically to their respective FFA advisor by Wednesday, August 31, 2022, at 4:30 p.m. Failure to do so will result in penalties outlined in the 2022 Fair Book.

- PLEASE REMEMBER:
 It takes several weeks for checks to clear the bank and all the necessary paperwork to be done on your sale of your animal; therefore, please do not call the 4-H Office to ask if your check is ready. Your check will be mailed directly to you by the Central Wyoming Junior Livestock Sale Committee after Wednesday, August 31, 2022.
- Wyoming State Fair animal checks will not be available until at least mid-September. If you deliver your Wyoming State Fair animal to the processing facility, you must bring a signed receipt from the facility to the 4-H Office.

Assistant Horse Superintendent Description Due: September 27, 2022

Purpose

To provide a positive learning experience for 4-H and FFA members and volunteers, and promoting a positive image of 4-H and FFA to the public.

Accountability

To work with supervision and direction of the Lead Horse Superintendent and the Natrona County 4-H Educator to organize, coordinate, and evaluate the horse project. To be accountable to the Lead Horse Superintendent and Natrona County Extension Educator and/or fair management.

Selection Procedures

Assistant Superintendent position vacancy will be announced in the 4-H newsletter. An application, provided in the newsletter and at the 4-H office, must be filled out and delivered to the 4-H office by the appropriate deadline as advertised in the newsletter. The Natrona County 4-H Educator with input from current superintendent, if applicable, will determine the final selection of the assistant horse superintendent.

Eligibility and Qualifications

Knowledge of the 4-H project area sufficient to ensure consistency between the project area, fair guidelines, judging, and exhibition.

- A sincere interest in working with other volunteers and professional staff in an educational setting and a willingness to become familiar with and work within the philosophy and guidelines of the University of Wyoming Extension and the Natrona County 4-H program.
- Year-round position with appointment beginning October 1 September 30 with most responsibilities relating to the Horse Show.
- Support the Lead Horse Superintendent and carry out those duties as assigned by the Lead Superintendent.
- The ability to work with minimal supervision but openly communicate with the Lead Superintendent and the 4-H Educator and staff in a timely manner.
- The ability to motivate youth and adults to assume leadership positions through delegation.
- The ability to utilize conflict resolution skills.
- The ability to work respectfully, tactfully, and communicate effectively verbally and in written forms including social media.
- The ability to organize information and materials.
- The ability to accept and follow through with responsibilities.
- The ability to assist in decisions by the Lead Horse Superintended in context with 4-H policies, the CWF fair book rules and in consultation with the Natrona County 4-H Extension Educator.
- Familiarity with the CWF.
- To be familiar with the project area as listed in the Fair Book.
- Be an enrolled 4-H leader or willing to become an enrolled 4-H leader.

Responsibilities:

- Follow all guidelines and policies of the University of Wyoming Extension 4-H and conduct activities in a safe and healthy manner and enforcing the 4-H Code of Conduct.
- Maintain the standards of the 4-H program by conducting oneself in a responsible and respectful manner and honor confidentiality.
- Serve as a role model and willingly share knowledge and involve youth and adults in the program.
- Assist in organizing and attend the entire horse show.
- Assistant Superintendent must be visible and available at the horse show and respond quickly to situations involving inhumane treatment of animals, safety issues, rule violations, and/or show management concerns.
- Maintain close contact with Extension staff and FFA advisors and the Lead Horse Superintendent.

Early in Calendar Year (October 1 – September 30)

- Attend pre-fair meetings.
- Contact new sponsors, if needed.
- Fund raising, as needed.
- Organize a class(es) or clinic(s
- Be available to confer on species-related issue(s) throughout the year.

Pre-fair

- Follow 4-H deadlines.
- Assist exhibitors in following bio-security guidelines/vet check

Horse Show

- Superintendent is to be present during horse arrival and departure times
 - Routinely check species area for health concerns.
 - Be available to answer questions from exhibitors, parents, leaders, and Extension staff.
 - Support appropriate animal welfare practices for positive public display.
 - Follow bio-security guidelines.
 - Follow the CWF fair book rules.

Show Day

- Prior to the show, get ribbons, prizes, and judging book from the 4-H office between the hours of Monday Friday, 8 a.m. 4:30 p.m.
- For the show, designate:
 - -ring announcer
 - -person to check 4-H and FFA exhibitors in
 - -ring person(s) to help exhibitors
 - -person(s) to pick up ribbons and prizes and organize judging area (table, signs, pens/pencils, chairs, etc.)
 - -person(s) to record ribbon placings
 - -person(s) to present ribbons and prizes
 - -additional helpers, as needed
- Greet and orient the judge when he/she arrives at the show ring


