Weigh-in's for hogs, lambs, and goats will be held from 3:30 - 6 PM on Tuesday, May 28th.

- You MUST have a bill of sale for your hog or goat. THE BILL OF SALE MUST BE IN THE CHILD'S NAME!
- You MUST have a brand inspection on your sheep and Scrapies tags for your goat and sheep.
- If you DO NOT have the mandatory paperwork your animal will not be allowed to walk across the scale.
- There will be a **MANDATORY** meeting for all members enrolled in a livestock and/or horse project and their parents. This will immediately follow weigh-ins.

The first award is called "Hands to Larger Service" and will be awarded to clubs who focus on community service efforts throughout the 2018-19 4-H Year. Awards of \$200 will be given to clubs for following a variety of criteria including creativity, quantity, and uniqueness. The second award is called "Head to Clearer Thinking" and will be awarded to clubs who focuses on educational programming efforts with club members.

Cloverbud Activity

Egg Drop Challenge

The egg drop challenge is one of our favorite STEM activities. The idea behind it is designing a container that can hold a raw egg and keep it from breaking when dropped from a high place.

Supplies:

- Raw eggs
- Be creative—use things around the house to challenge the youth to be resourceful

Set Up:

- 1. Let your child test their ideas out and make changes if needed. Remind them that this is how scientists and engineers learn; they make mistakes and they come up with new ideas to try.
- 2. Once the egg drop containers are built, and the eggs are safely tucked inside, it's time to find a high spot to drop them from. If you have a ladder handy you can carry the containers up and drop them from the top of the ladder.
- 3. Once they've been dropped, carefully open each container to see if it was successful.

Colored Deviled Eggs

Supplies:

- 6 large hard boiled eggs
- Food coloring
- 1 cup cold water
- 1 tsp vinegar for each color
- 1/2 teaspoon mustard
- 2 tablespoons miracle whip or mayonnaise
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1 pinch paprika

Instructions:



- 2. Peel eggs and slice in half lengthwise
- Place food coloring and a teaspoon of vinegar in each glass
- Place egg whites in the dye—making sure to push them under
- 5. After a minute or two remove from dye and allow to air dry
- 6. Mash egg yolks in a small mixing bowl and add miracle whip or mayonnaise and mustard.
- 7. Spoon into egg whites and sprinkle with paprika if desired
- 8. ENJOY!





Hard Boiled Eggs

Find yourself a tall sided saucepan then add your eggs so that they are in one layer. You don't want to pile them in there, when the water we're adding in the next step begins to boil, we don't want to risk cracking one or more of the egg's shells. Add cold water. You want the water to cover the eggs by 1 to 2 inches. Bring the water to a boil. The moment the water begins to boil, cover the pan with a lid and cook for 30 seconds. After 30 seconds, move the pan off of the heat then set a timer for 12 minutes and you're set.
