Members will need to bring a notebook, pencils, sunscreen and water!

If you are wanting to be on the Livestock Judging team at State Fair you must participate in 2 of the 3 county practices and the county contest held during county fair.

COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

In order for a 4-H member to complete each 4-H project taken, the 4-H member must enter at least one exhibit per project at the Niobrara County Fair (or other approved public event). The Junior Leader project is an exception to this rule. Each member must also submit a **COMPLETED** Record Book for each project taken and a Record Book folder. If each of the member's Record Books does not receive at least a red ribbon, their County Fair premiums will be forfeited. The folder includes: a Cover; the appropriate record books; the 4-H Portfolio; and a 4-H Story. Record Books are due in the Extension Office mid-September every year (the date changes slightly each year due to the calendar). **All Record Books of every 4-H member WILL be judged.**

Members must also attend at least one county wide judging in their respective project area. For example, livestock project members a livestock judging and horse members a horse judging. Family & Consumer Science members must participate in at least one county Family & Consumer Science Activity Day to complete their project.

Instated in 2018, ALL members enrolled in a livestock project are also required to attend at least one of the several Educational Opportunities offered throughout the year - in addition to the one required livestock judging.

Weigh-in Info

Weigh-in's for hogs, lambs, and goats will be held from 3:30 - 6 PM on Tuesday, May 28th.

- You MUST have a bill of sale for your hog or goat. THE BILL OF SALE MUST BE IN THE CHILD'S NAME!
- You MUST have a brand inspection on your sheep and Scrapies tags for your goat and sheep.
- If you DO NOT have the mandatory paperwork your animal will not be allowed to walk across the scale.
- There will be a **MANDATORY** meeting for all members enrolled in a livestock, poultry and/or horse project and their parents. This will immediately follow weigh-ins.
- Please see the 'Family Back-up Animal' rules in the Member Handbook on page 28.

Educational Opportunity Workshops

Again for the 2018-19 year - you will be required to attend one of the many Educational Opportunities offered throughout the year. There will be opportunities to learn more about Animal Nutrition, Selection and Management, Reproduction, Record Books, Showmanship, Entrepreneurship, Livestock Skill-A-Thon and more! If you are planning to sell an animal in the 2019 Market Animal Sale at the Fair, you will be required to attend one of the workshops. You may attend as many as you would like, but one is mandatory. This doesn't take the place of the required Livestock Judging. This will be in addition to the Livestock Judging requirement. This is a fair requirement and applies regardless if you are in 4-H or FFA. Watch your newsletter and Facebook for upcoming dates, there will be an opportunity each month until July. 



Cloverbud Activity

Grow A Seed Jar

Supplies:

- Paper Towels
- Water

- Seeds (pea and bean seeds grow quickly)
- Large jar

Set Up:

- 1. Fill the jar with paper towels. Kids can fold them and push them down into the jar.
- 2. Gently water your seed jar to wet the paper towels. DO NOT FLOOD!!!
- 3. Carefully push seeds down into the paper towels around the edge of the jar so they can still be seen. Make sure they are firmly in place.

WHAT DO YOU SEE IN YOUR SEED JAR?

- You are looking for a root to pop out of the side.
- Next, you are looking for the root to push down into the soil.
- Then, you are looking for root hairs.
- Next, you are looking for the seed to push up while the root hairs push down.

- 3. Taste each of the seeds
- 4. Then discuss fruits and vegetables that have seeds that we don't eat (peaches, apples, oranges, peppers, etc.)
