There will be opportunities to learn more about Animal Nutrition, Selection and Management, Reproduction, Record Books, Showmanship, Entrepreneurship, Livestock Skill-A-Thon and more! If you are planning to sell an animal in the 2019 Market Animal Sale at the Fair, you will be required to attend one of the workshops. You may attend as many as you would like, but one is mandatory. This doesn't take the place of the required Livestock Judging. This will be in addition to the Livestock Judging requirement. This is a fair requirement and applies regardless if you are in 4-H or FFA. Watch your newsletter and Facebook for upcoming dates, there will be an opportunity each month until July. 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

If you are wanting to be on the Livestock Judging team at State Fair you must have participated in 2 of the 3 county practices and the county contest held during county fair.

COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS


In order for a 4-H member to complete each 4-H project taken, the 4-H member must enter at least one exhibit per project at the Niobrara County Fair (or other approved public event). The Junior Leader project is an exception to this rule. Each member must also submit a **COMPLETED** Record Book for each project taken and a Record Book folder. If each of the member's Record Books does not receive at least a red ribbon, their County Fair premiums will be forfeited. The folder includes: a Cover; the appropriate record books; the 4-H Portfolio; and a 4-H Story. Record Books are due in the Extension Office mid-September every year (the date changes slightly each year due to the calendar). **All Record Books of every 4-H member WILL be judged.**

Members must also attend at least one county wide judging in their respective project area. For example, livestock project members a livestock judging and horse members a horse judging. Family & Consumer Science members must participate in at least one county Family & Consumer Science Activity Day to complete their project.

Instated in 2018, *ALL members enrolled in a livestock project are also required to attend at least one of the several Educational Opportunities offered throughout the year - in addition to the one required livestock judging.*

Sharpie Tie-Dye T-Shirts

Supplies: Set Up:

- T-shirts
- Sharpies
- Rubbing Alcohol

QUESTIONS TO ASK?

- What happens if?
- Can you think of another way to try that?
- How could we make this idea even better?
- What ideas have we talked about that you haven't tried yet?

Sharpie Tie Dye projects have been very popular in the past years because they are a really easy and fast way to create tie dye effects on fabric. During this project you will get to use your creative skills to design your own t-shirt!


For this project, you need permanent markers (like sharpie's), a plain t-shirt, rubbing alcohol, and a piece of cardboard or plastic to put between the layers of t-shirt so it doesn't bleed through the back side of your shirt. You will also need an eyedropper for dropping rubbing alcohol onto the artwork you create. The more alcohol you drop, the more the color will spread across the shirt!

Hawaíían Cream Popsícles

Supplies:

- 1 14oz can of Coconut Milk
- 1 cup of fresh Pineapple
- 1 cup of fresh diced Mango
- 1 Banana
- 3 to 4 tbsp of Sugar



- 1. If you're using wooden popsicle sticks soak them in water for about 10-15 minutes. This helps the wooden sticks stay in place and not float to the top.
- Next, blend one 14oz can of coconut milk, 1 cup of fresh pineapple, 1 cup of fresh diced mango, 1 banana, and 3-4 tbsp of sugar
- 3. Lastly, pour the mixture into popsicle molds, insert popsicle sticks, and freeze until solid.
- 4. This recipe makes approximately 10 Hawaiian Cream Popsicles.




