

Cloverbud Activity

Halloween Pumpkin Catapult

Supplies:

- Jumbo popsicle or craft sticks
- Rubber bands

- Bottle cap
- Hot glue gun

 Fun items to fling—plastic eyeballs, spiders or candy pumpkins

INSTRUCTIONS

- Start by securing 8 jumbo craft sticks together at the ends with rubber bands. The bands should be wound tightly
- 2. You will then take one stick and wedge it into the stack just above the bottom stick. Make sure to center it in the stack.
- 3. Place the remaining craft stick on the top of the stack in line with the one you just added.
- 4. Secure the tips together with a looser rubber band. It needs to have some give to get a good launch.
- 5. Grab your launching items and get started!

Catapult Science Experiment


You can easily set up an experiment by testing different weighted items to see which ones fly farther. Adding a measuring tape encourages simple math concepts. Always start by asking a question to come up with a hypothesis. Which item will go farther? "I think _____ will go father." Why? Have the kids fire each material (candy pumpkin, plastic spider or eyeball) 10 times and record the distance each time. What kind of conclusions can they draw from the information? Which item worked the best? Which item didn't work well at all?

You can also test out the amount of popsicle sticks used in the stack to create the tension needed to launch the catapult. How about 6 or 10. What are the differences when tested?

What's the Science behind the popsicle catapult?

First off this is a great simple physics activity for kids of multiple ages. You can talk about stored energy or potential elastic energy as you pull back on the popsicle stick, bending it. When you release the stick all that potential energy is released into energy in motion producing the projectile motion. A catapult is a simple machine that has been around for ages. Have your kids dig up a little history and research when the first catapults were invented and used! Hint check out the 17th century!

Candy Corn Fruit Parfait

Ingredients

- 2 (15 ounce) cans mandarin oranges
- 3 cups fresh pineapple, cut into chunks
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 3-4 tablespoons powdered sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- Candy corn for decorating

SCLOVER BUDS

Instructions

- 1. Into a decorative glass, layer fresh pineapple on the bottom and mandarin orange slices on top of it
- 2. Make the whipped cream: In a large bowl combine heavy whipping cream, powdered sugar and vanilla. Beat until stiff peaks form
- 3. Top fruit with whipped cream
- 4. Add a few candy corn on top of the whipped cream and serve.





Dear 4-H Volunteer Leader,

4-H is a program of the University of Wyoming and anytime you transport 4-H members you are driving on University business. UW policy requires individuals who drive on University business to complete the UW Motor Vehicle Records (MVR) check annually. This applies to all driving, whether doing so in a personal, rental, county vehicle or UW vehicle. All MVR checks expire on December 31st. However, MVR checks completed after October 1, apply to the next calendar year. For example, if you complete the MVR check on October 2nd, 2014, you are eligible to drive through 2015.

It will be easiest if you print off these instructions before you log into the MVR page below.

Log into: <u>UW OFFICIAL VEHICLE USE POLICY INFORMATION, INSTRUCTIONS, and FORMS</u>

- · Select form to request driving privileges click on NOT A UW EMPLOYEE
- · The first time you log on, you will be asked to create a profile
- · Create a username and password, click Register
- Add your e-mail address
- Motor vehicle records input form you will be instructed to enter information exactly as it appears on your driver's license.
- · In the following fields, enter the information as instructed below:
 - o Department/Organization enter UW Extension
 - o Supervisor/Sponsor enter name of county 4-H educator (listed below)
 - o In the "NOTIFY" field enter Allison, Karen
 - o Click the appropriate boxes for permission
 - o Click on the submit button
