Fabric and Fashion

These cold winter months are a great time to get lots of sewing projects completed while it is too cold and snowy to spend much time outside! It is also a great time to get your sewing kit organized and restocked. Below is a list of the essentials in my sewing kit (one that I created as a first-year 4-H member a LONG time ago and have kept and continue to maintain and update.

- Hand sewing needles
- Thread (start with basics like black, white, brown, blue, red, etc.)
- Safety pins
- Straight pins
- Fabric Scissors—I have several sizes including thread snips and large shears
- Pincushion (I prefer my magnetic pin cushions)

- Tape measure
- Seam ripper (the most used item in my box!)
- Marking pen or pencil
- Seam gauge
- Sewing machine needles
- Extra bobbins

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It hasn't been too terribly cold....yet, so maybe you've been able to do some riding. But if not there are some things you can do to be ready for the spring riding season. First, make sure your friend's mane and tail are free of cockle burrs and any other annoying stickers. Plus, I'm sure he/she likes to be brushed, this is a good way of keeping tabs on their health during the cold winter months. Second, what kind of condition is your tack in? This would be a great time to get a jump on cleaning and repairing your tack in readiness for spring and summer riding. Be sure to find out the proper cleaner for your particular equipment before starting.

When I was young I cleaned my saddle in my folks' dining room (it had a linoleum floor). I put papers down, put the saddle stand (when one was available) in the middle of the papers and put my saddle on the stand. I took the latigo and cinches off and laid them out. All the while checking to see if they were in good repair, such as no slices, cuts, abrasions, or tears. The next thing is to find a plastic scraper and scrape off the sweat, mud, and manure as much as possible. Be careful not to gouge the leather. On that particular saddle I used saddle soap, except on the latigo and leather strings. On the latigo, leather strings, headstall, and split reins I used Neats Foot oil, oiling them very well. Yes, this oil can stain your clothing and get your hands oily, but it's really good for your leather. The leather will absorb it, more so as the weather warms. The saddle I have now is a rough out saddle and I just use oil on it. It was recommended by the seller to use olive oil, which I did, and it's in good shape.

The next item would be your saddle blanket/pad. It's a whole lot easier if you keep up with hair removal. A curry comb or mane comb can be used to remove the hair. Perhaps you have a better tool to do that with, if so be sure and share that idea with your fellow horse enthusiasts. Some people wash their saddle pads, I never have, but if you use soap make sure it is all rinsed out to eliminate any possible irritation.

I'm definitely not an expert, but I will find an answer to your question if I don't know it.




