Disciplinary Protocol for 4-H Rule Violations

If a 4-H member is in violation of a rule specified in the Teton County Fair Book, or 4-H Code of conduct, the following steps will take place:

1)The issue will be discussed at a meeting with the member's club leader(s), a parent, and the 4-H Educator.

2)If not rectified, and/or if disciplinary action may be warranted, the member and those leaders or other volunteers involved will present the situation to a rule enforcement committee. The youth member's parent should be present but will not initially present the issue to the committee. The rule enforcement committee should consist of at least one member of the council executive group (president, vice-president, secretary), three or more other council members, and the 4-H Educator.

3)The rule enforcement committee will hear all sides of the issue and make a recommendation to the 4-H Educator whether or not to take disciplinary action, and if so what that measure would be. The 4-H Educator will have final authority to enforce the committee's recommendation or not based on input from the committee, professional discretion, and state office guidance.

4)In cases where time or circumstances do not allow for the aforementioned steps to take place (for instance, during fair week), an expedited process may take place as determined by the 4-H Educator.
