WYOMING ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM AND 4-H HONORS CLUB



ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

In addition to awards for competitions, participation recognition, or project ribbons at the county or state fair, Wyoming 4-H has an annual recognition of youth based on the extent of their 4-H involvement during the entire 4-H program year. Each year youth can be recognized a Green, Silver or Gold member at the county level and receive a medallion sticker to add to their 4-H Certificate of Achievement.

TO ACHIEVE GREEN

- The member has turned in all the required enrollment materials
- o has behaved in an appropriate manner at all 4-H activities, events, and meetings
- o is enrolled in at least one project
- o and is enrolled in at least one club
- o Green members do not earn any achievement points towards the Honors Club

TO ACHIEVE SILVER

- The Member meets criteria for Green, AND...
 - The Member has exhibited what they have learned at some point during the current 4-H year with others.
 - Member provides documentation of setting goals, knowledge/skills gained, and participation in a project via the 4-H Record book
- Silver members earn one point for the Honors Club

TO ACHIEVE GOLD

- Member meets criteria for Silver, AND...
 - Member provides documentation in all essential elements of positive youth development via the 4-H Record book
- Gold members earn three points for the Honors Club

HONORS CLUB

The ultimate achievement that a 4-H member can obtain is inclusion in the Wyoming 4-H Honors Club. It is based on the principle of recognition for youth that maximize their opportunities to foster the elements of positive youth development which are belonging, independence, generosity, and mastery over multiple years of engagement. Nineteen (19) points must be accumulated from annual recognition points earned. Honor's club inductees are given special recognition that includes an exclusive UW Cowboy Clover tie/lapel pin or necklace/bracelet charm, and a \$500 travel scholarship.

The travel scholarship can be used towards the international trips, National 4-H Congress in Atlanta, National 4-H Conference, Citizenship Washington Focus or Leadership Washington Focus in Washington DC, Western National Roundup in Denver, awards trips for the various judging programs or Fabric and Fashion awards trips.



PREPARED PRESENTATION

Judged on knowledge of subject matter, presentation manner and impact.

Categories:

- Demonstrations
 - o Show how to do something great for new presenters
- Illustrated Talks
 - Uses visual aids (props, posters, computer-based visuals, handouts, video, etc.) to show and tell others how to do something.
- Speeches
 - No visuals or equipment is used challenging for experience presenters

IMPROMPTU PRESENTATION

Emphasizes the need for participants to think clearly and effectively on a topic with a short amount of preparation time.

How it works:

- Contestant will draw three topics from a pool of questions.
 The contestant will choose which topic they would like to give the presentation on and return the other two choices to the bucket. No two contestants will have the same topic.
- 2. Contestant will be allowed 3 minutes to organize their thoughts before beginning the presentation.
- 3. Contestants can organize their thoughts on a blank notecard that will be provided at the contest. Excessive use of notes may be counted against the contestant.

Will be relative to today's youth and may include current events, 4-H, and/or social issues

- One issue facing teenagers today is...
- If I could describe my personality as a tree, which tree would I be?
- What has being involved in 4-H taught me?

Food, Fun & 4-H

This is a self-paced project to get young people in the kitchen and preparing home cooked meals, trying new foods, encouraging family time, developing communication skills and having fun! In addition to promoting kitchen and cooking skills, Food, Fun, 4-H will teach youth how to be smart consumers through planning, time management and budgeting. Each family/household will receive a kitchen utensil kit related to that month's recipes, along with other informational materials. Youth must prepare at least two of the recipes in the packet and complete a post-lesson report, answering three questions 1) I liked... 2) I wish... and 3) I wonder... Participants will be asked to submit two photos – one of them preparing the dish and the other of the family unit sharing the meal. Completion of these requirements by the end of the month qualifies them to receive the next month's utensil kit. The questions are meant to get the youth thinking about ways to either modify or enhance the recipes for when they make it again, can it be doubled or halved. These are lifelong skills that might lead them down the road to becoming entrepreneurs! The program will run November to May. If they don't meet the requirements, it doesn't exclude them from future participation. They will just need to wait a month and try again. There isn't a cost to participate, but families/households will need to purchase their food/pantry items.

If participating at home doesn't work for you, or even if you choose to participate at home, there is a second option. Each month I will be hosting an afternoon to come cook with me at the Extension Office with the Food, Fun & 4-H Club and complete the project.
