What is the benefit of being in a 4-H club ...

There are many benefits of being in a club; friendship and fellowship, opportunity for leadership development, plus strides in self-confidence, learning to work with others, communication skills, decision making, problem solving, citizenship, expanded horizons, organizational skills, respect for and from others, patience, tolerance, and real-world experience! The club leader will help you with decision making, keep you informed about project announcements and deadlines, and will be a great encouragement!

LEADERSHIP

What is a leader?

- A leader is someone who helps coach, guide and inspire others.
- A leader inspires passion and motivation

Learning to be a Leader

Leadership skills can be learned and developed through the many opportunities 4-H has to offer. 4-H'ers learn about leadership and practice those skills through activities such as taking part in 4-H club meetings, presenting information at various events, designing and implementing activities for younger youth, and carrying out community service projects as individuals or with a group. 4-H teaches youth the life skills necessary to effectively lead others. These important life skills will be used in jobs, in careers, in service clubs, in communities and in daily activities as an adult.

By taking part in 4-H, young people can acquire the leadership life skills they need to take responsibility for their actions and to work with others in achieving individual and group goals.

For your Record Book...

Leadership actions are things you did that demonstrated how you took initiative and guided or led others. Things such as offices in clubs, committees, marketing and promoting, or things asked by others to lead in. Include any 4-H leadership role you held throughout the year. Do NOT include experiences outside of 4-H in this section. Be specific when listing your leadership activities and roles. Instead of just listing "Fair Basket" you should write "I was appointed to serve as a member of the Clover Club Fair Basket committee".

Types of Leadership:

Volunteer: did you volunteer to help another member with a project at fair? Help do a community service project?

Appointed: were you appointed to serve on a committee or did the president appoint you to lead the pledges at the 4-H meeting?

Elected: were you elected to serve as an officer or as a member of a committee?





Food, Fun & 4-H

This is a self-paced project to get young people in the kitchen and preparing home cooked meals, trying new foods, encouraging family time, developing communication skills and having fun! In addition to promoting kitchen and cooking skills, Food, Fun, 4-H will teach youth how to be smart consumers through planning, time management and budgeting. Each family/household will receive a kitchen utensil kit related to that month's recipes, along with other informational materials. Youth must prepare at least two of the recipes in the packet and complete a post-lesson report, answering three questions 1) I liked... 2) I wish... and 3) I wonder... Participants will be asked to submit two photos – one of them preparing the dish and the other of the family unit sharing the meal. Completion of these requirements by the end of the month qualifies them to receive the next month's utensil kit. The questions are meant to get the youth thinking about ways to either modify or enhance the recipes for when they make it again, can it be doubled or halved. These are lifelong skills that might lead them down the road to becoming entrepreneurs! The program will run November to May. If they don't meet the requirements, it doesn't exclude them from future participation. They will just need to wait a month and try again. There isn't a cost to participate, but families/households will need to purchase their food/pantry items.

If participating at home doesn't work for you, or even if you choose to participate at home, there is a second option. Each month I will be hosting an afternoon to come cook with me at the Extension Office with the Food, Fun & 4-H Club and complete the project.




