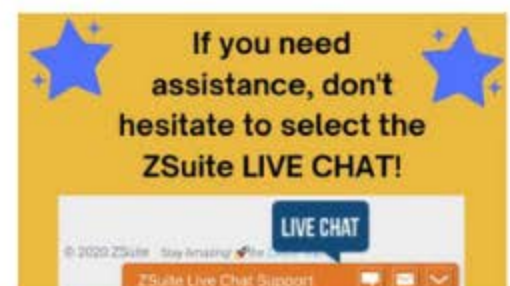
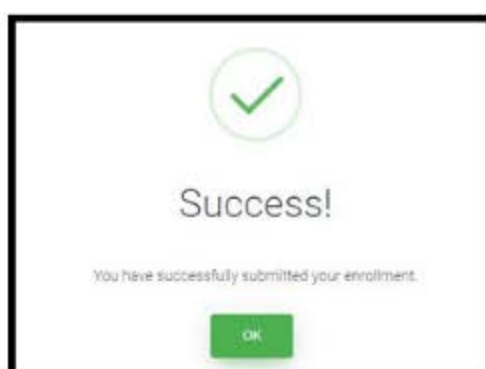


Adding a Project to ZSuite



Existing Family Profile

1. Go to: <https://4h.zsuite.org/>
2. Use the same email and password you updated your enrollment with, select **LOGIN**.
3. Choose the **PRIMARY ACCOUNT** that was used to enroll each 4-H member and Volunteer.
 - a. Click Choose Profile, enter your PIN, and click SUBMIT.
4. Click **> UPDATE ENROLLMENT** next to the 4-H participant name that you are adding the project to.
5. Click on **CLUBS** and **+ADD PROJECT**.
6. Select the project and click **ADD PROJECT**.
7. Click **Submit**; You will get a pop-up box that says **Success!** once your new project has been added.
8. The Extension Office will get an email stating that you have updated an enrollment.

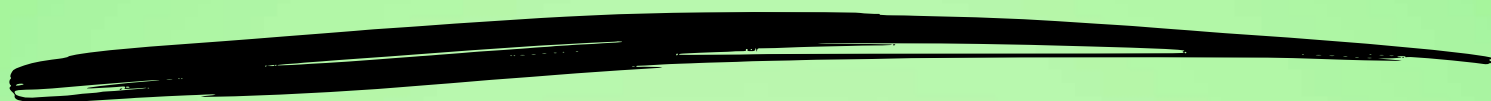
Shooting Sports Season is HERE!

The Congressional Award is the United States Congress’ award for young Americans. It is non-partisan, voluntary, and non-competitive. The program is open to all youth regardless of ability, circumstance, or socioeconomic status. Participants earn Bronze, Silver, and Gold Certificates and Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medals. Each level involves setting goals in four program areas; Voluntary Public Service, Personal Development, Physical Fitness, and Expedition/Exploration.

Earning the Award is a fun and interesting way to get more involved in something you already enjoy or something you’d like to try for the first time. You move at your own pace, on your own or with your friends. This is not an award for past accomplishments. Instead, you are honored for achieving your own challenging goals.

Regardless of your situation, you can earn The Congressional Award. The Congressional Award has no minimum grade point average requirements. It accommodates young people with special needs or disabilities who are willing to take the challenge.
