










September - October	Shopping Time Most of the show cattle in Wyoming are bought around this time
October - January	Feed, Feed, Feed. Also a crucial time to halter break. Time to start hair care!
January - February	Tagging in January. February 1 is Ownership Deadline. Keep feeding!
March - May	If you haven't started hair care and daily work with show sticks, you may be behind your competition! Daily routines are your friend!
June - July	Keep them cool! Need to practice both showing and standing your cattle. They will need to stand for a while on show day!
July - August	Enter your projects for fair. Clip cattle for Fair. County and State Fair TIME!

IMPORTANT ANNOUNCEMENT

Market Animal Tagging and Paperwork Requirements

NEW IN 2025

- All exhibitors must be enrolled in 4-H or FFA, have completed Weston County Market Animal Identification forms, ownership paperwork (brand inspection or statement of ownership) and clear pictures submitted to the Extension Office by the ownership and tagging deadlines
- · Five photos must be submitted for each animal showing:
 - · Full face showing tag
 - · Full body left side
 - · Full body right side
 - · Close up of the tag with all 15 digits readable
 - Full hind view
- . To check out tags to tag your market animals at home you must be enrolled in 4-H or FFA and bring ownership paperwork (Brand inspection or statement of ownership) to the Extension Office to receive tags.
- . The Wyoming State Fair and Weston County Fair will be accepting USDA 840 tags as official identification for Market Animals

Ownership and Tagging Deadlines

Market Beef - February 1 Market Sheep, Swine and Goats - June 1

Photos will be taken at the scheduled Junior Livestock tagging/weighing dates by a designated Junior Livestock Committee member.

IF ALL REQUIREMENTS ARE NOT MET BY THE OWNERSHIP/TAGGING DEADLINES THAT ANIMAL WILL NOT BE ELIGIBLE TO COMPETE AT THE WESTON COUNTY FAIR AND THE WYOMING STATE FAIR.

We know Wyoming kids have a heart for helping; we also know you're never too young to join the fight against food insecurity.














83,000 of our neighbors struggle with food insecurity. Fair to Fork is making a difference.




