I hope you'll take advantage of them and try something new this year. Hopefully you have set some goals for your 4-H projects and involvement this year. If not, here is a reminder to get them written down and start working on achieving them!

Learning to set goals is an essential life skill to develop. Goals should change and become more challenging each year to show growth in a project.

What is a goal? A goal is the specific result or purpose expected from the project.

When setting goals think about making the goal specific, measurable, achievable, relevant and time-bound - also known as SMART goals.

- Specific - what will be done and who will do it
- Measurable - how the action will be measured, measuring your goal helps you determine if you are making progress and keeps you on track and on schedule
- Achievable - goal is realistic, this helps set up the project for success
- Relevant - does the goal make sense
- Time-bound - a specific timeline for completion

Goals should also be able to pass the "control test". Does the 4-H member have control over the outcome of the goal or does someone else have that control?

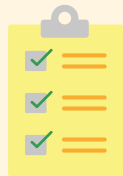

October 5 – 11th – National 4-H Week – no enrollment cost

October 12th – December 31st – \$10 per member

January 1 – May 15th – \$20 per member

Enrollment Deadline

Youth must be enrolled with active status in 4-H in order to participate in any 4-H activities. Enrollment fees are due at the time of enrollment. Please note: youth are not covered by the 4-H insurance until you have active status in ZSuite!

Youth must have active status by May 15th to participate in summer activities (camp, fair, etc.) This deadline will be strictly adhered to.

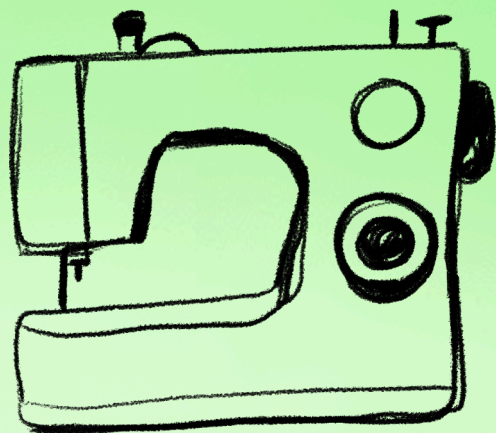

SHOWCASE SHOWDOWN INFO

AgRobotics: Teams design, build, and program a LEGO robot to complete agriculture-themed challenges autonomously in a timed match. Known challenges are released ahead of time, with surprise challenges revealed on contest day to test problem-solving and adaptability.

Sumo: Teams build a robot designed to push an opponent out of a 4-foot ring. The contest is divided into junior and senior divisions and uses a Swiss tournament game for fast-paced, head-to-head competition.



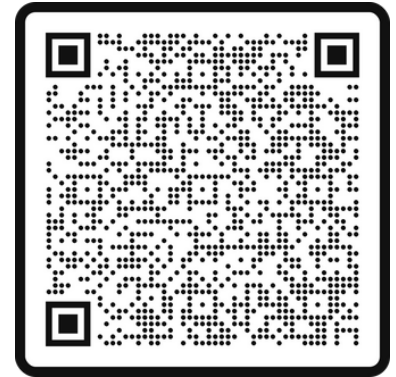
